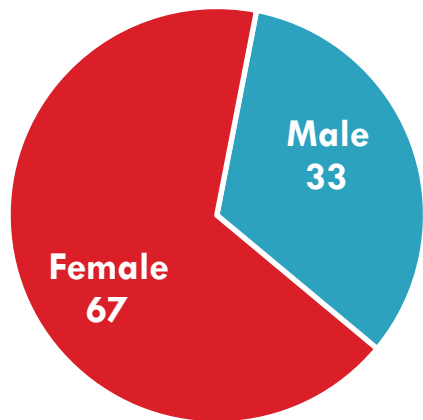

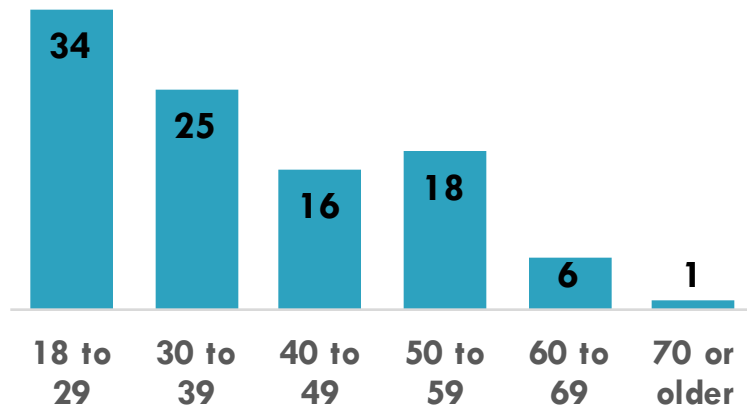

# Community Influencers (N=175)

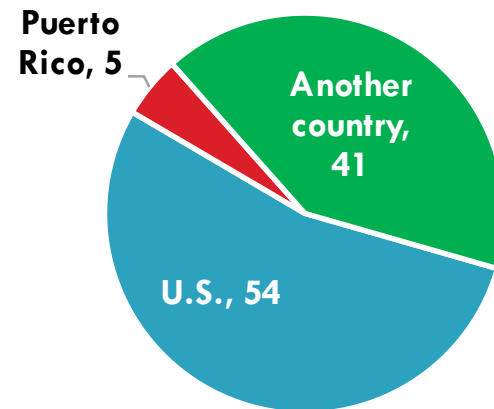
Gender

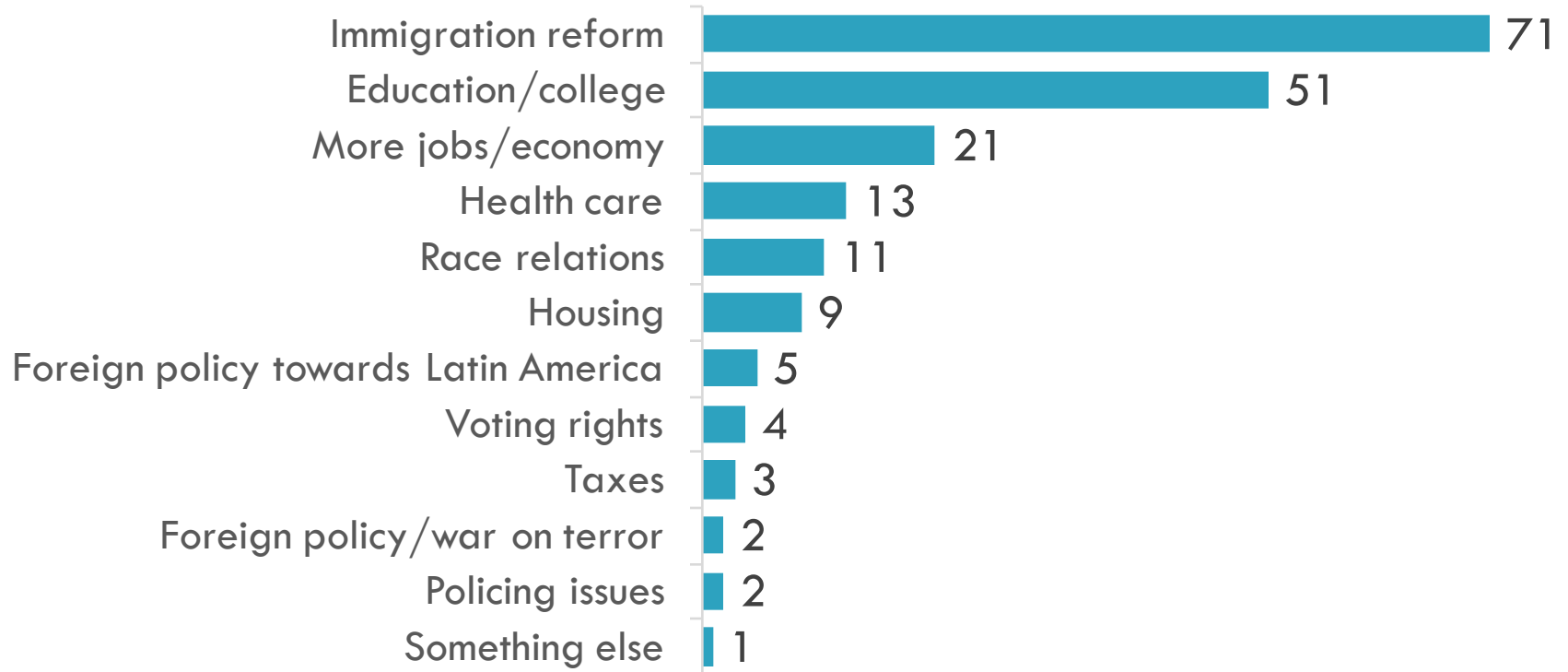

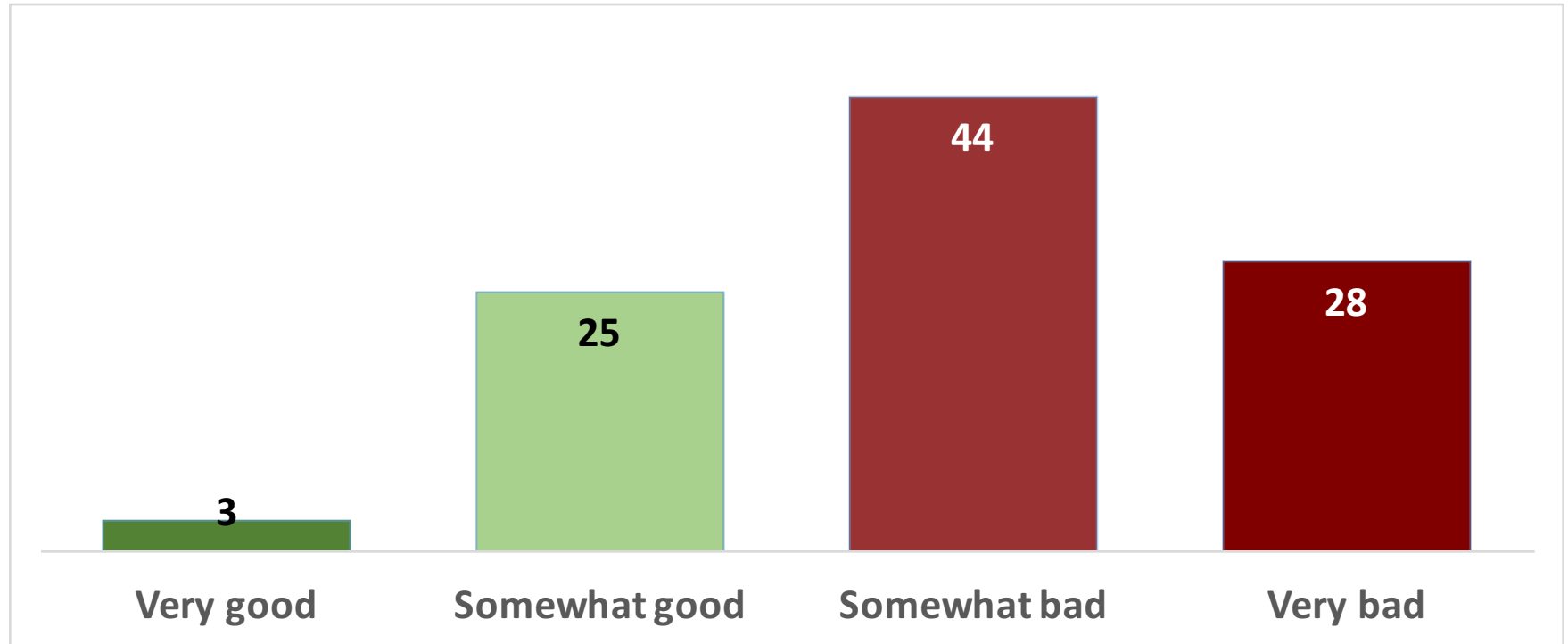

# What are the most important issues facing the Hispanic and Latino community that you want political candidates to address this year?

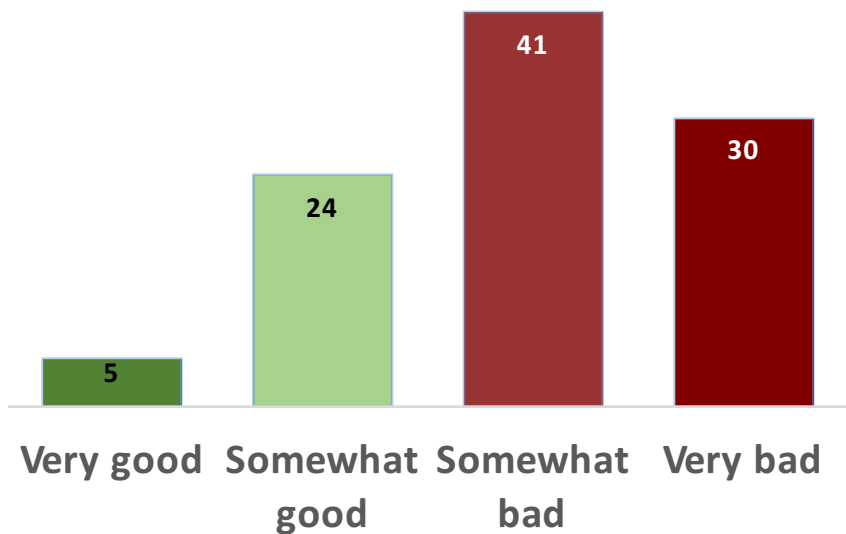


# How good or bad of a job do you think policy makers in Washington D.C. do at taking the Latino community perspective into account when they pass laws and debate the issues?

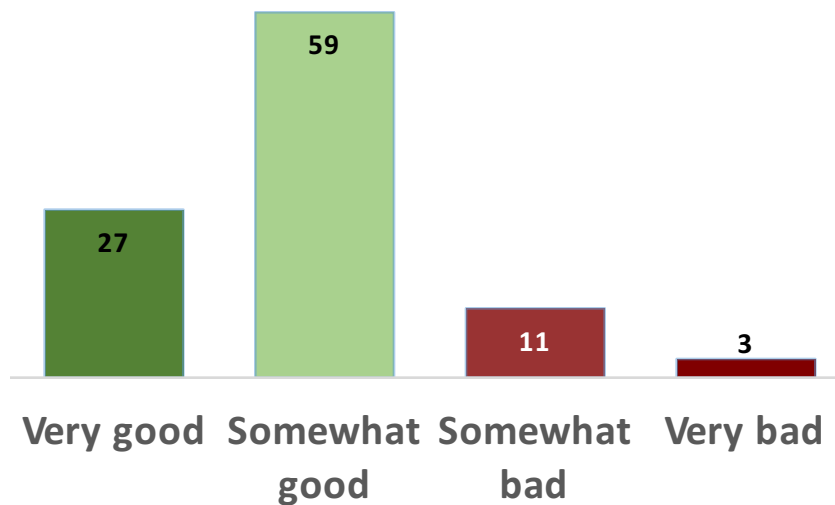


# How good or bad of a job do you think the English and Spanish language media does at taking the Latino community perspective into account when they report on the issues?

English Language Media



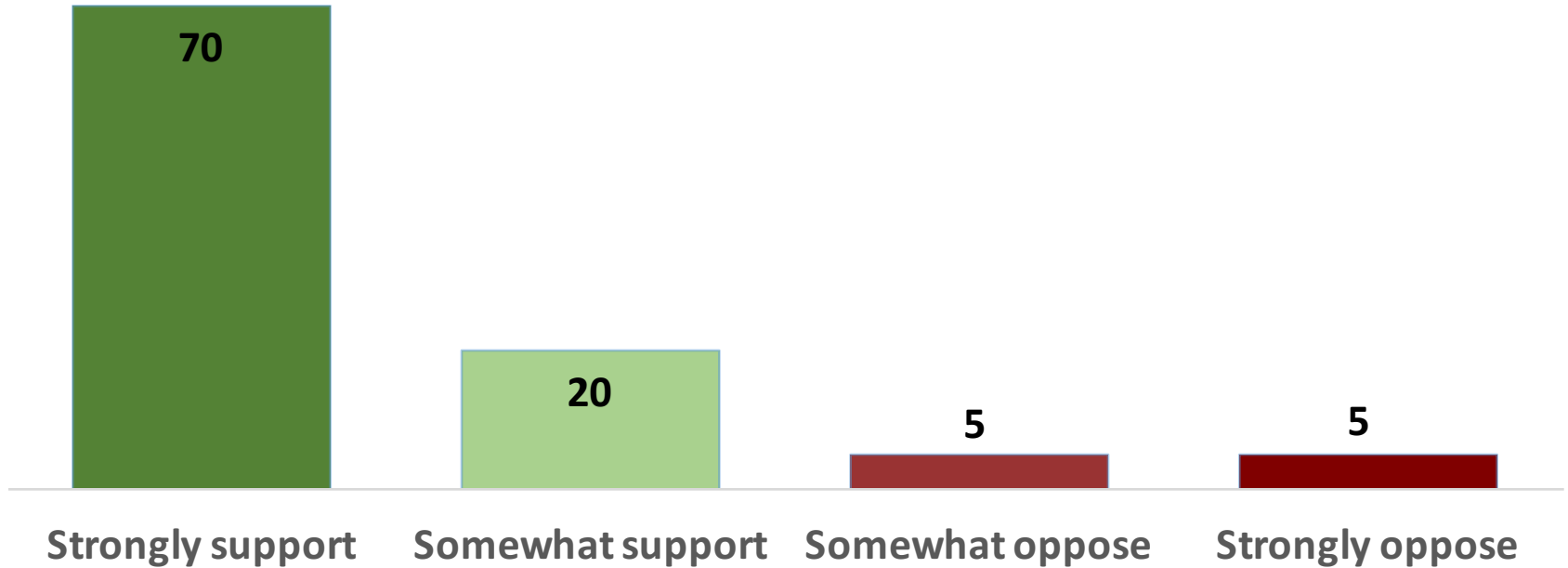

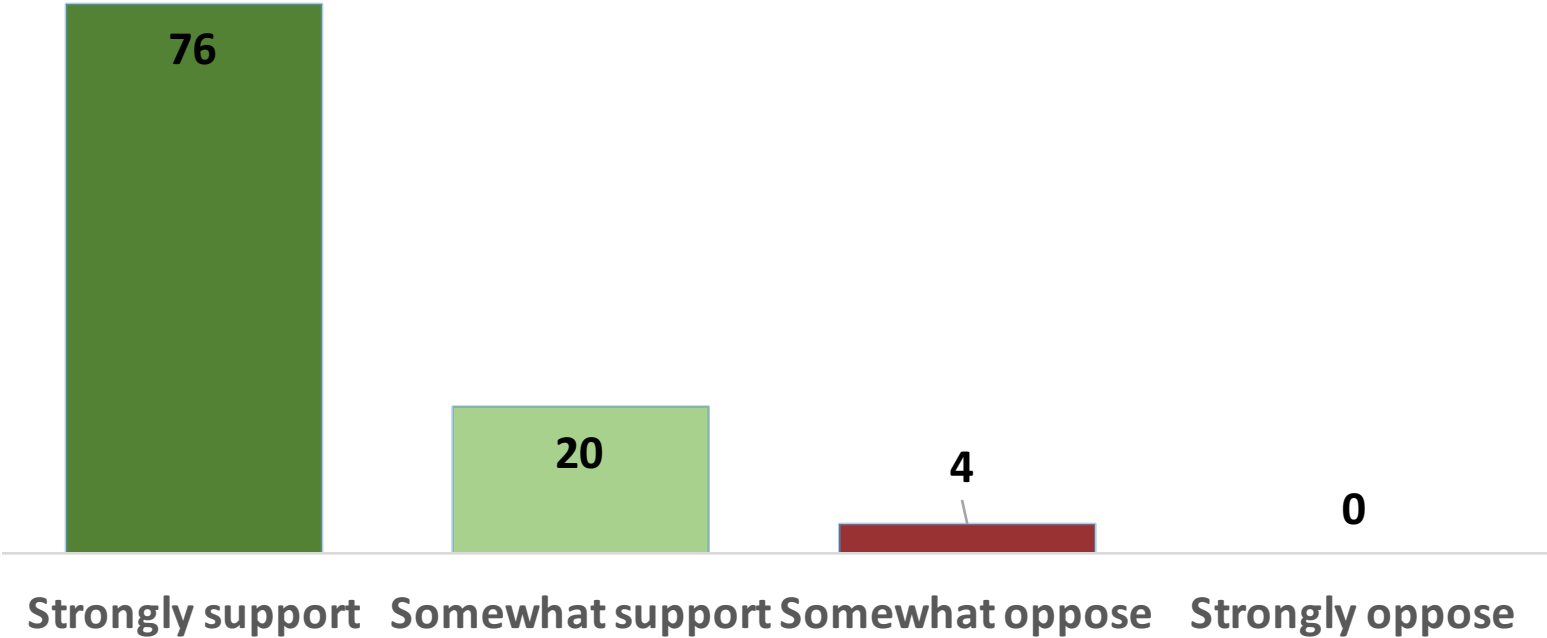


## Raise the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to at least \$12.00 per hour

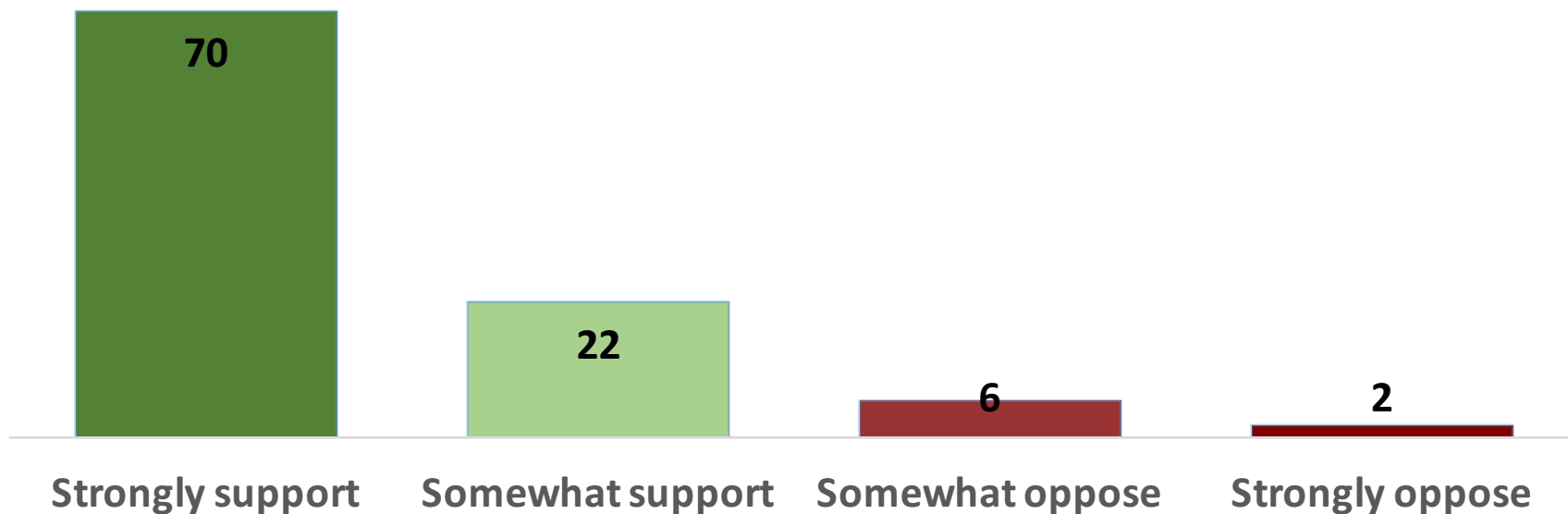




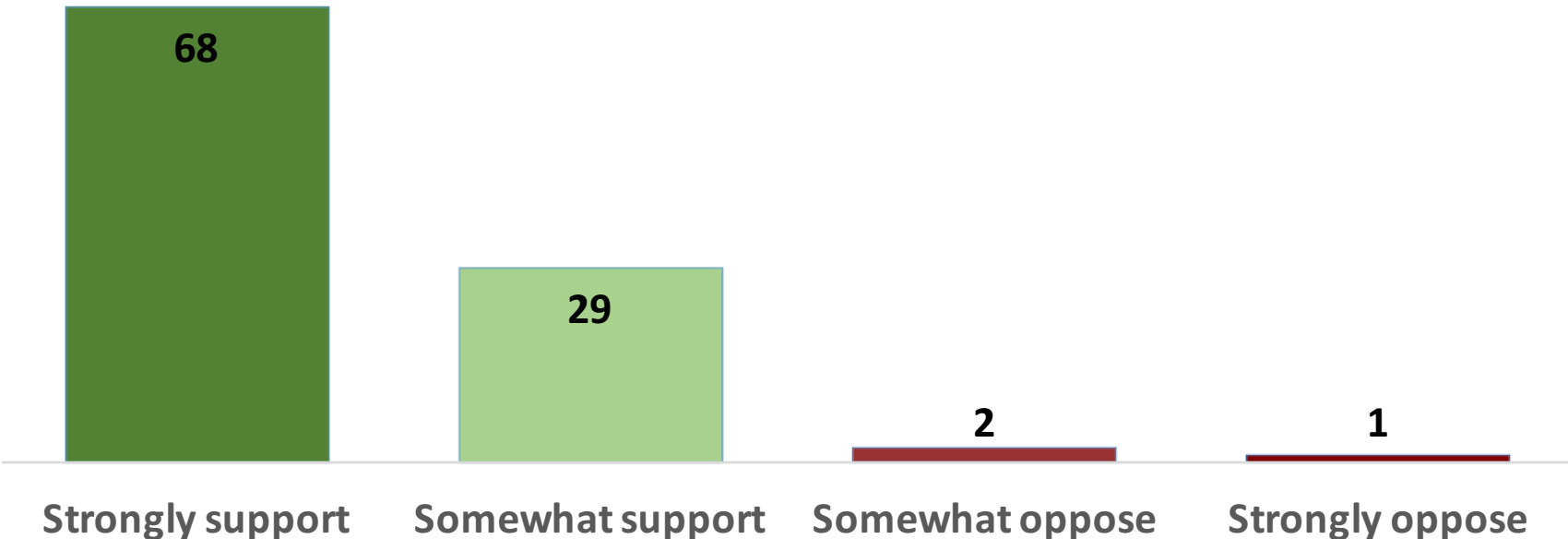
# The states should accept Federal money to expand Medicaid, to provide health insurance to low-income individuals and families



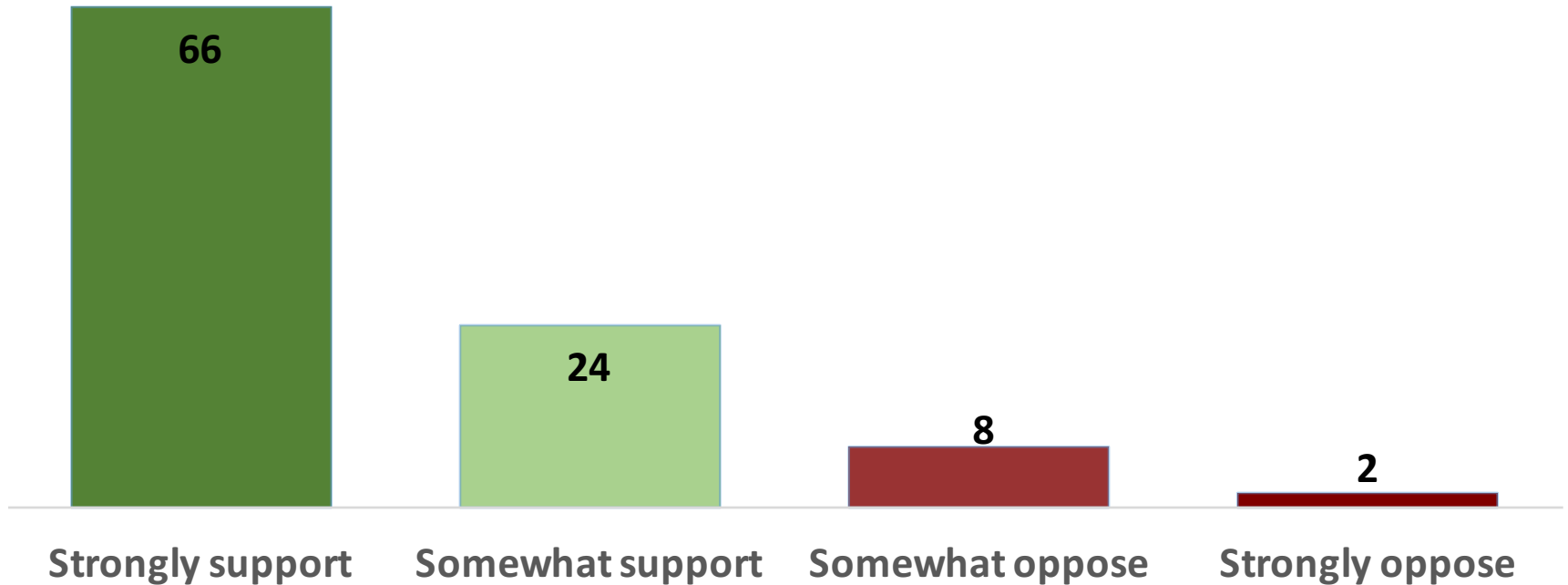
Pass comprehensive immigration reform which strengthens border security, cracks down on employers who break the law, and provides an eventual pathway to citizenship for undocumented immigrants



# Address climate change by passing legislation to require 50% of all power produced in the United States to be clean energy by the year 2030

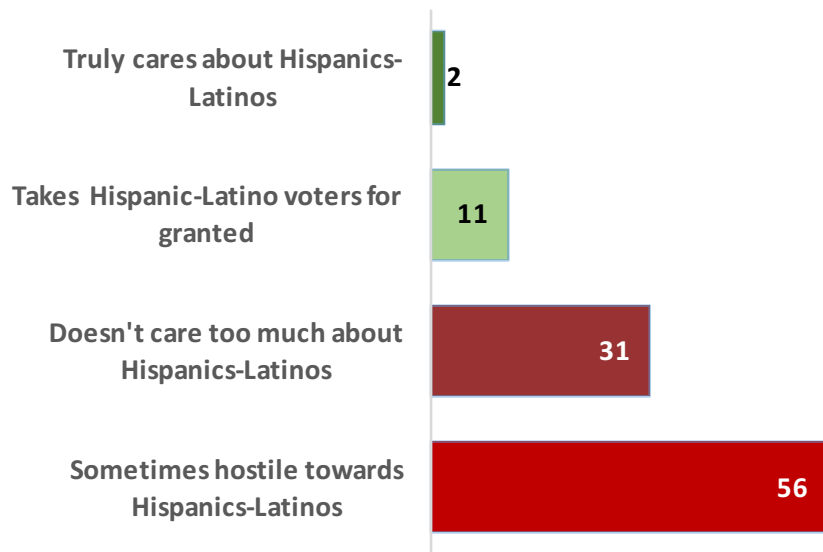


# The federal government should invest more in financial aid so more students can afford college, even if it means raising taxes

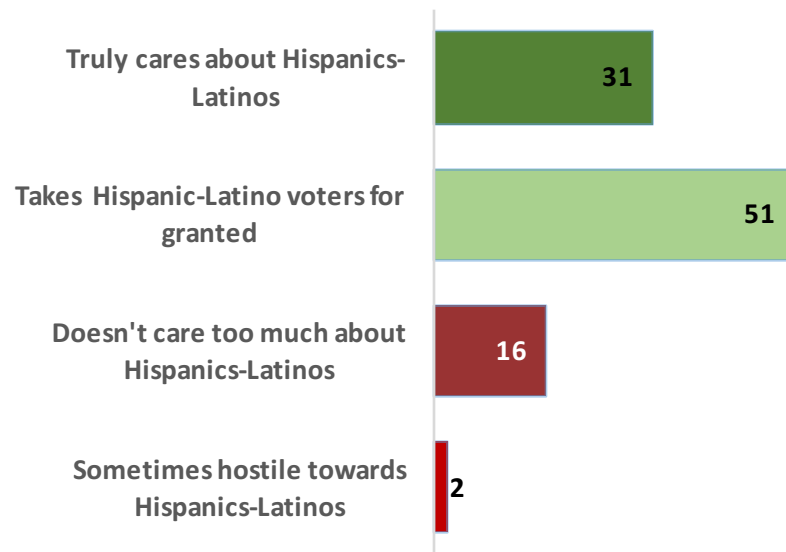


# Generally speaking, which best describes the Republican and Democratic Parties today?

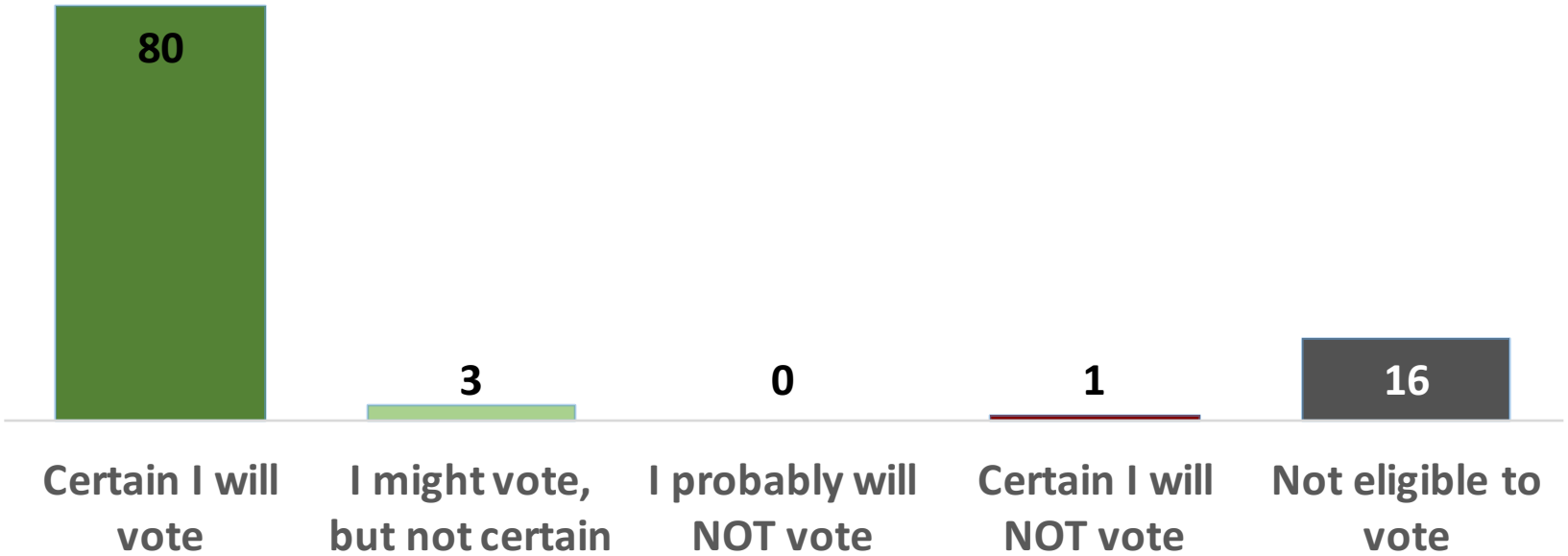
