

AMERICA'S FUTURE: Latino Child Well-Being in Numbers and Trends

The National Council of La Raza (NCLR) recently released a data book that examines 25 indicators of child well-being for Latino children across the nation. The report, *America's Future: Latino Child Well-Being in Numbers and Trends*, was coauthored by the Population Reference Bureau and integrates a range of key factors and outcomes in demography, citizenship, family structure and income, education and language, health, and juvenile justice.
