- Latino voters want the government to implement policies to help improve their financial situation




Latino Decisions

Have your personal finances gotten better, worse, or stayed the same over the past few years




A very large portion of registered voters are still deeply impacted by the recession


A very large portion of registered voters are still deeply impacted by the recession



Will you achieve the American Dream?



Which is part of achieving the American Dream




Foreign-born Latinos are the most likely to agree:

68% owning business


Barriers to achieving the DREAM

Making homeownership possible


Government can do different things to help qualified people to buy a house. For each of these, tell me if you think this policy would be helpful or not helpful to people trying to buy homes.
