SURVEY OF LATINO VOTERS IN NEVADA

About the Survey

- Total N=3,037 Latino eligible voters
 - N= 2,703 registered
 - N= 330 eligible, not registered
 - Margin of error +/- 1.8%
- Oversamples
 - N=300 per: Arizona, California, Georgia, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania (+/- 5.7%)
 - N=400 Florida, Texas (+/- 4.9%)
- Field Dates: Nov 2 - 13, 2023
- English or Spanish, according to preference
- Mixed mode: 75% online, 25% live telephone interviews

Key Findings in Nevada

1. Nevada Latinos' top issues are consistent with Latinos across the country: inflation, jobs, health care costs, housing cost, crime/guns, and immigration.

- Food and basic necessities, housing/rent, gasoline and health insurance are the principal issues driving concern about inflation
- Jobs/economy concerns are largely focused on the need for better pay, with some worry about benefits
- For healthcare, the costs of insurance and prescription drugs worry Nevada Latinos deeply

2. Immigration remains a priority issue in Nevada, ranked as 6th top issue closely following crime/gun violence.

- Providing a path to citizenship for Dreamers and other immigrants with long-standing ties in the country are the two major policies Latino voters want to see advanced on immigration.
- Nevada Latinos also want to see protections against deportation and expanded pathways for legal immigration

Key Findings Continued:

3. Latino voters see Democrats as more aligned with their values and views, on a host of issues including treating people with dignity/respect, democracy and elections, health care, and elections. Yet many Latino voters don't feel that either party truly cares about the Latino community.

4. Looking forward to the 2024 elections, Incumbent Senator Jacky Rosen and President Biden hold substantial polling leads among Arizona's Latino electorate at this very early stage.

- Incumbent Senator Jacky Rosen leads Republican candidate Sam Brown by more than 28 points
- President Biden's approval rating stands at 52%, and in potential 2024 match-ups he holds a 25+point lead over former President Trump and 35+point lead over Florida Governor Ron DeSantis.

5. In 2024, 19% of Latinos in Nevada will be voting in their first presidential election

- 13% for the first time in ANY federal election
- Another 18% voted for the first time in 2020
- 36% of Nevada's Latino electorate is new since Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump faced off in 2016.

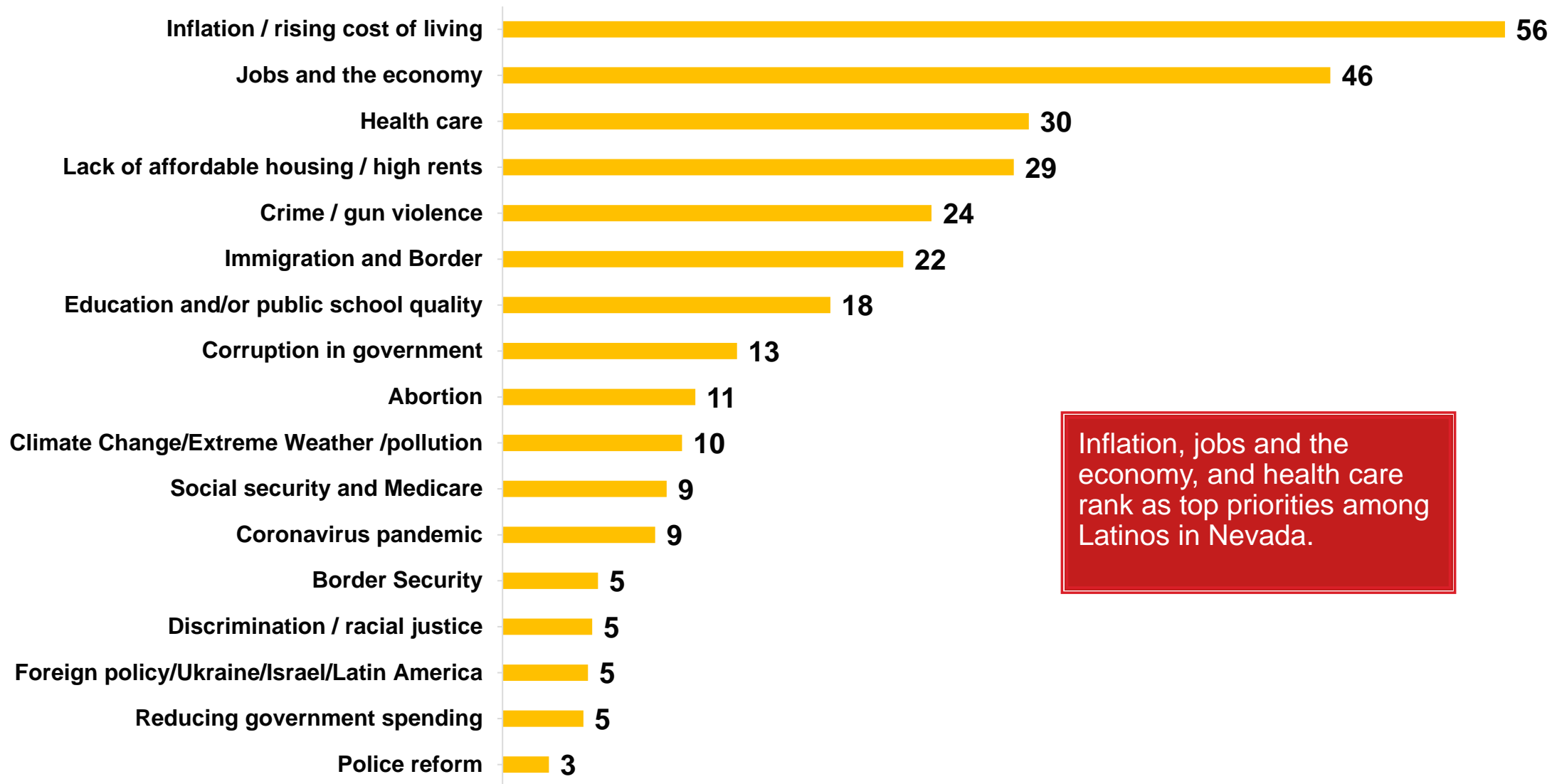

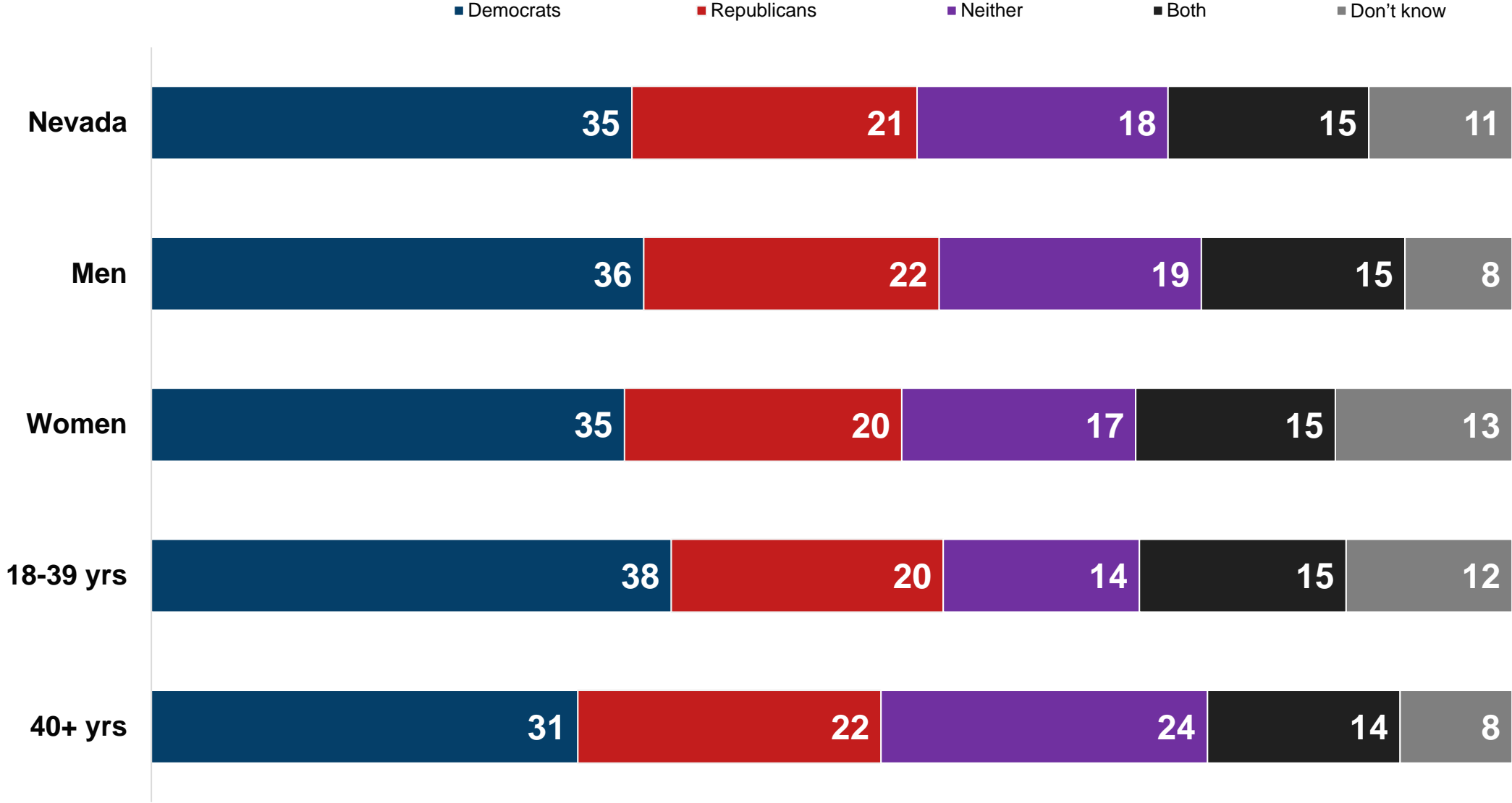
What are the most important issues that elected officials should address?

(Rank up to three. Sorted highest to lowest)



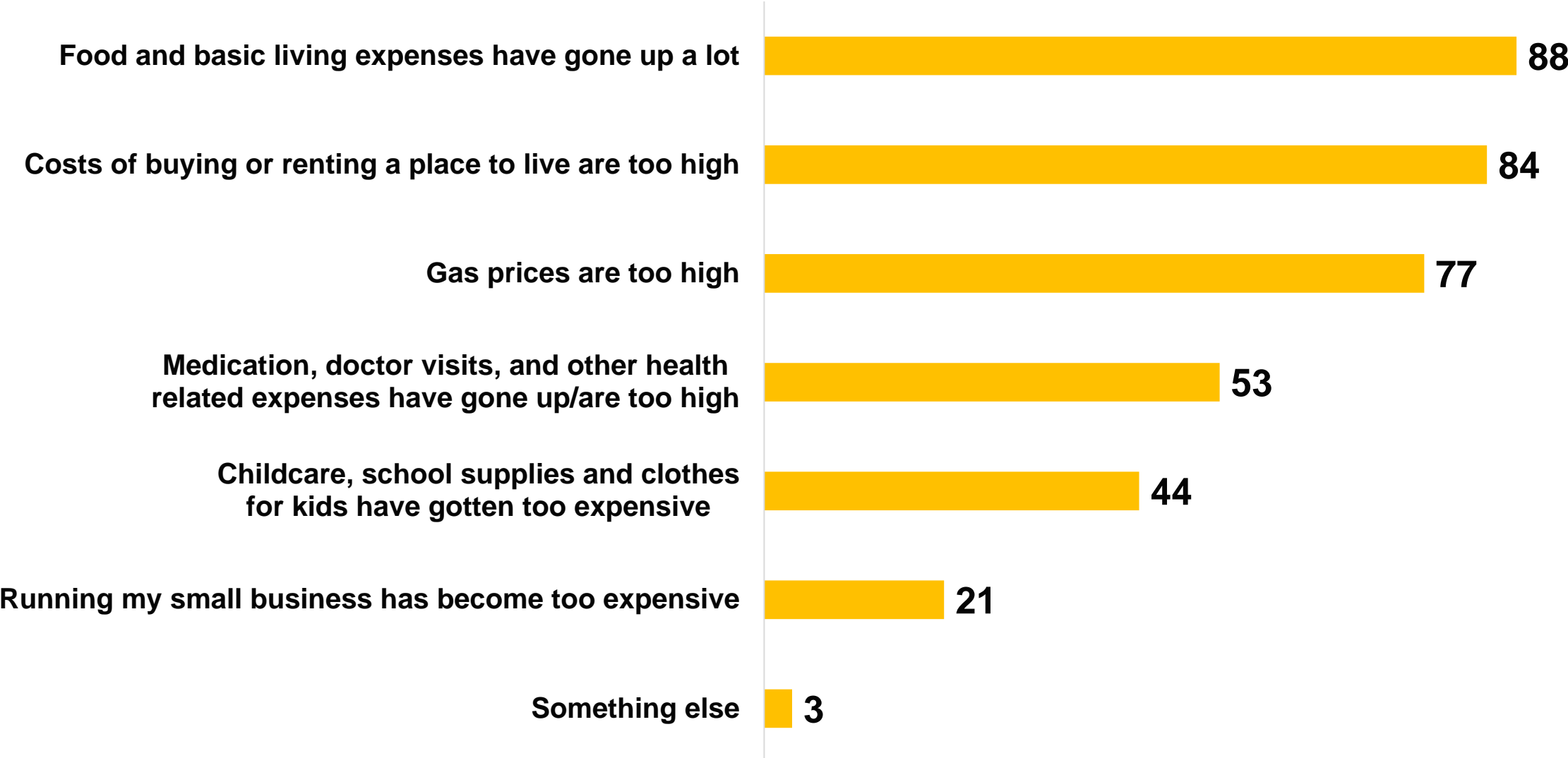
Inflation, jobs and the economy, and health care rank as top priorities among Latinos in Nevada.

Which party would be best at addressing [issue respondent cited as top concern/priority]?

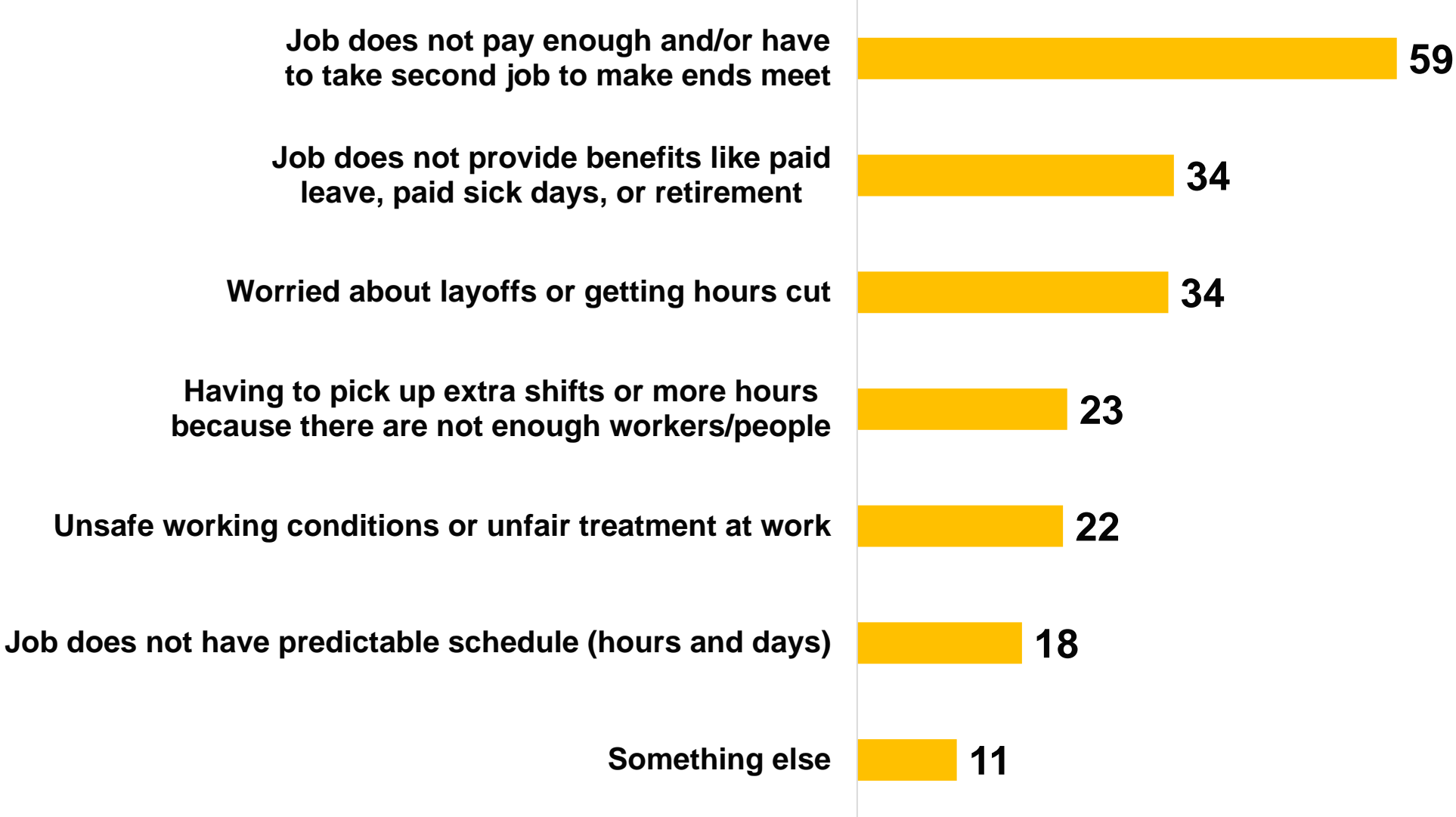

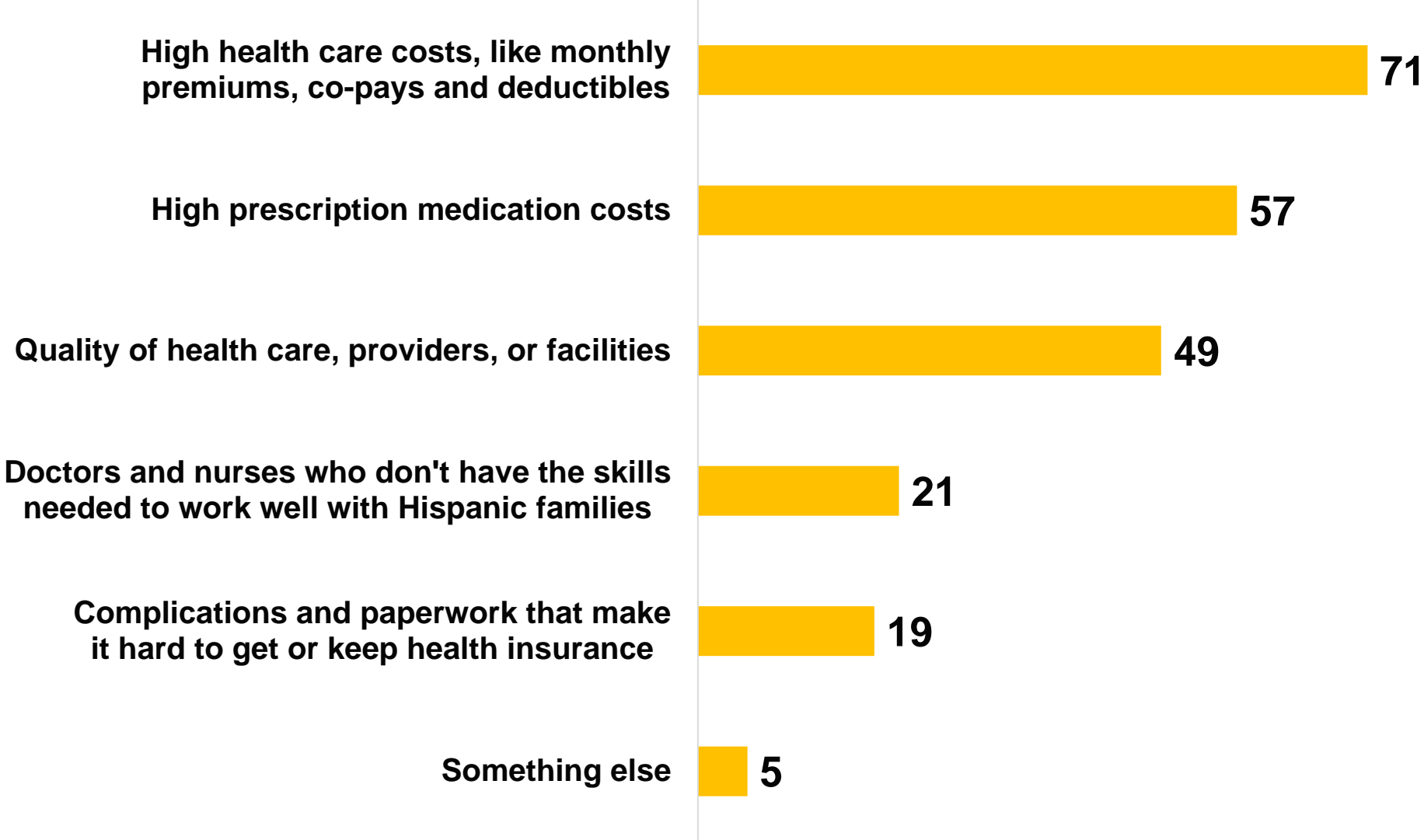
What did you have in mind when you said *inflation and the rising cost of living* are important issues elected officials should address? (all that apply)



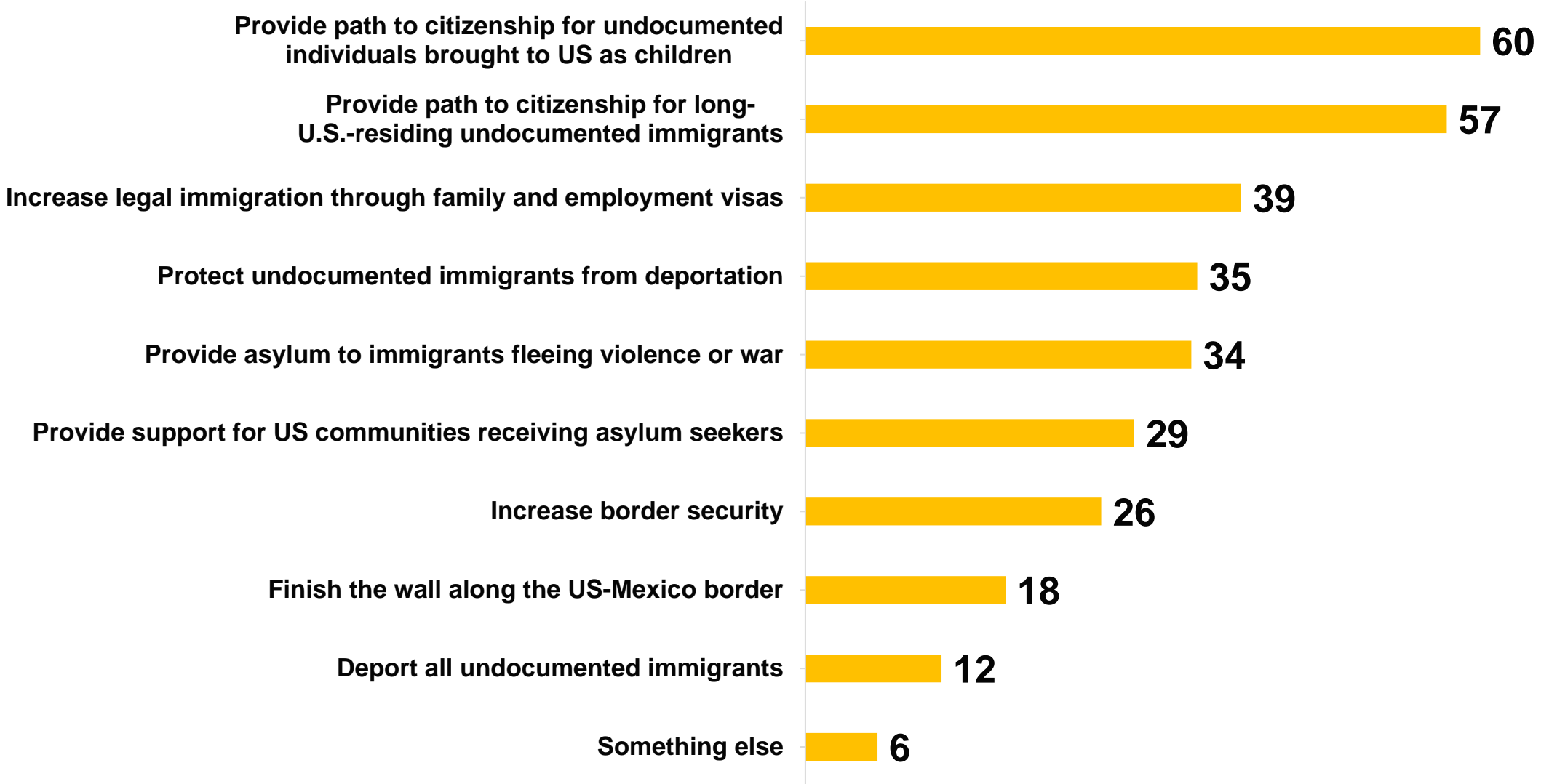
What did you have in mind when you said *jobs and the economy* are important issues elected officials should address? (all that apply)



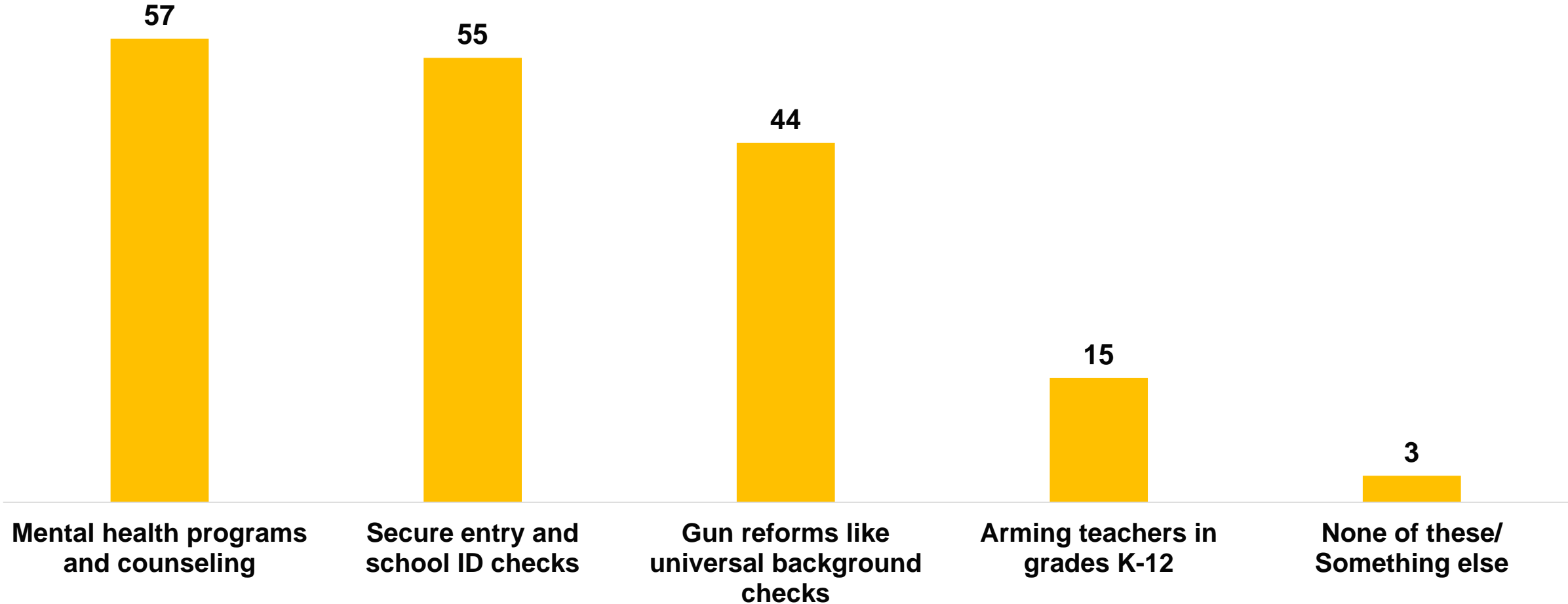
What did you have in mind when you said *health care* is an important issue elected officials should address? (all that apply)



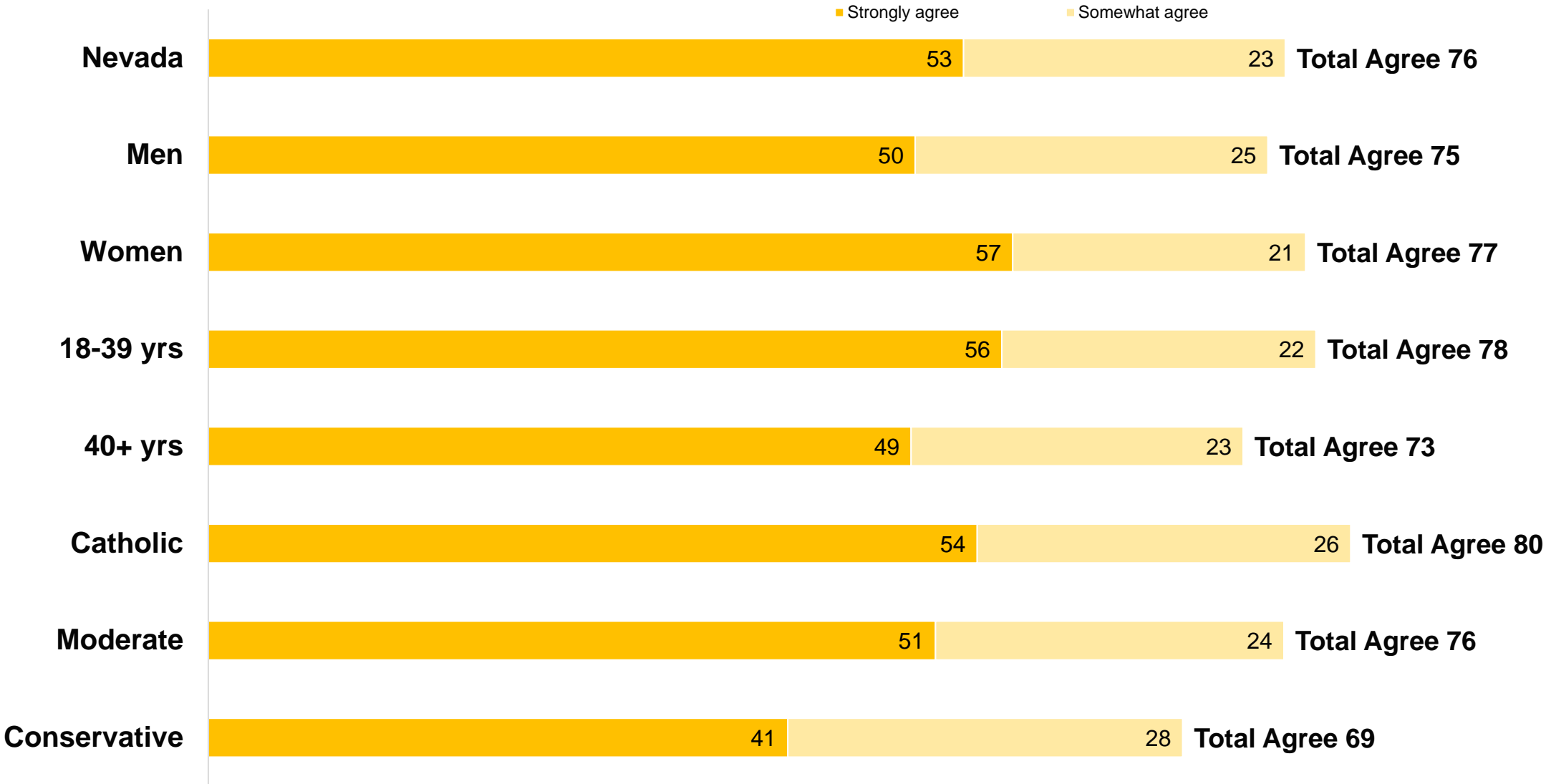
Thinking about the US immigration system, which of the following do you think are the most important issues that elected officials should address? (All that apply. Sorted highest to lowest.)



Which policies do you think would be the best solutions to make schools in your community safer for students and teachers? (all that apply)



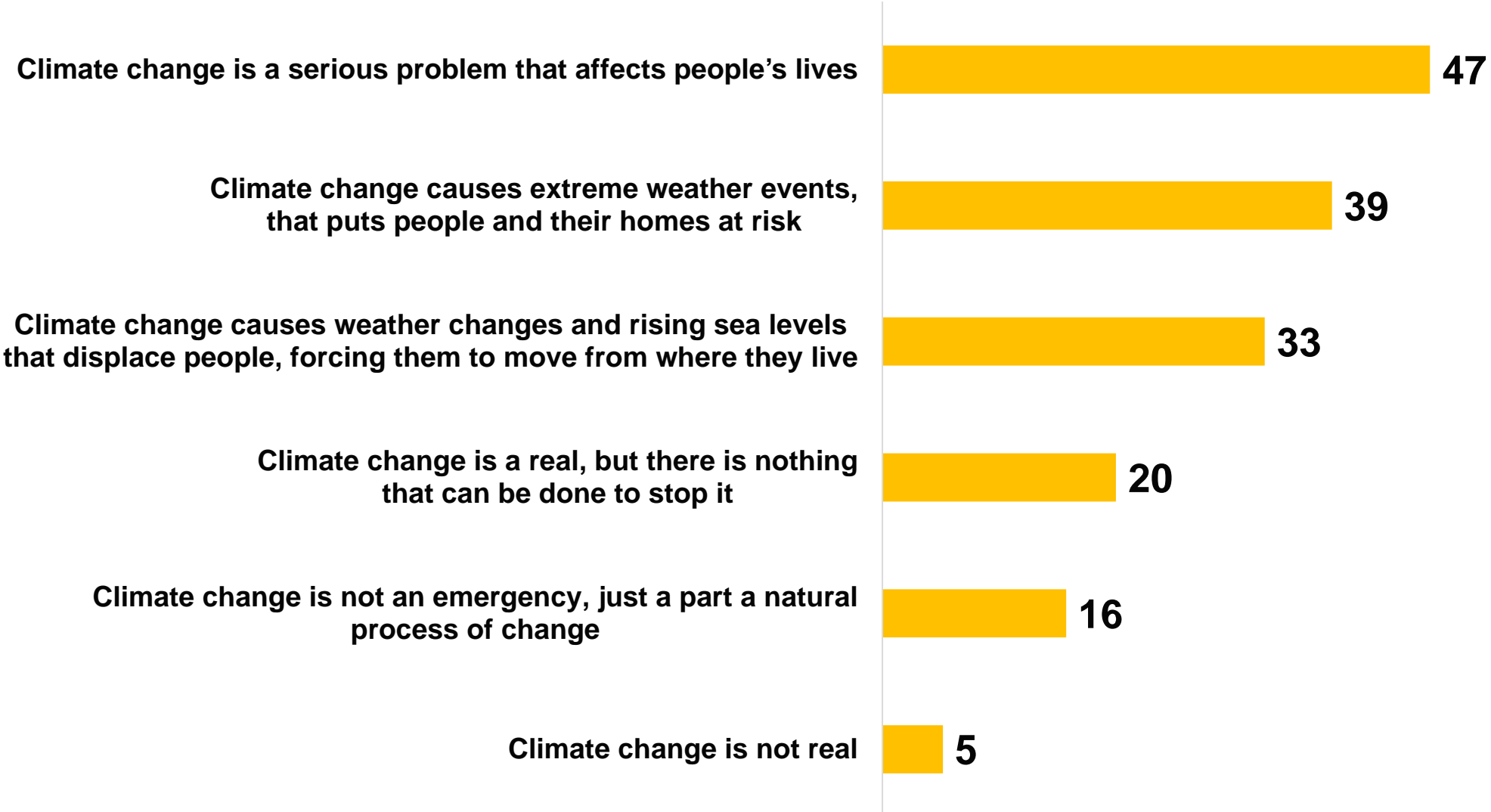

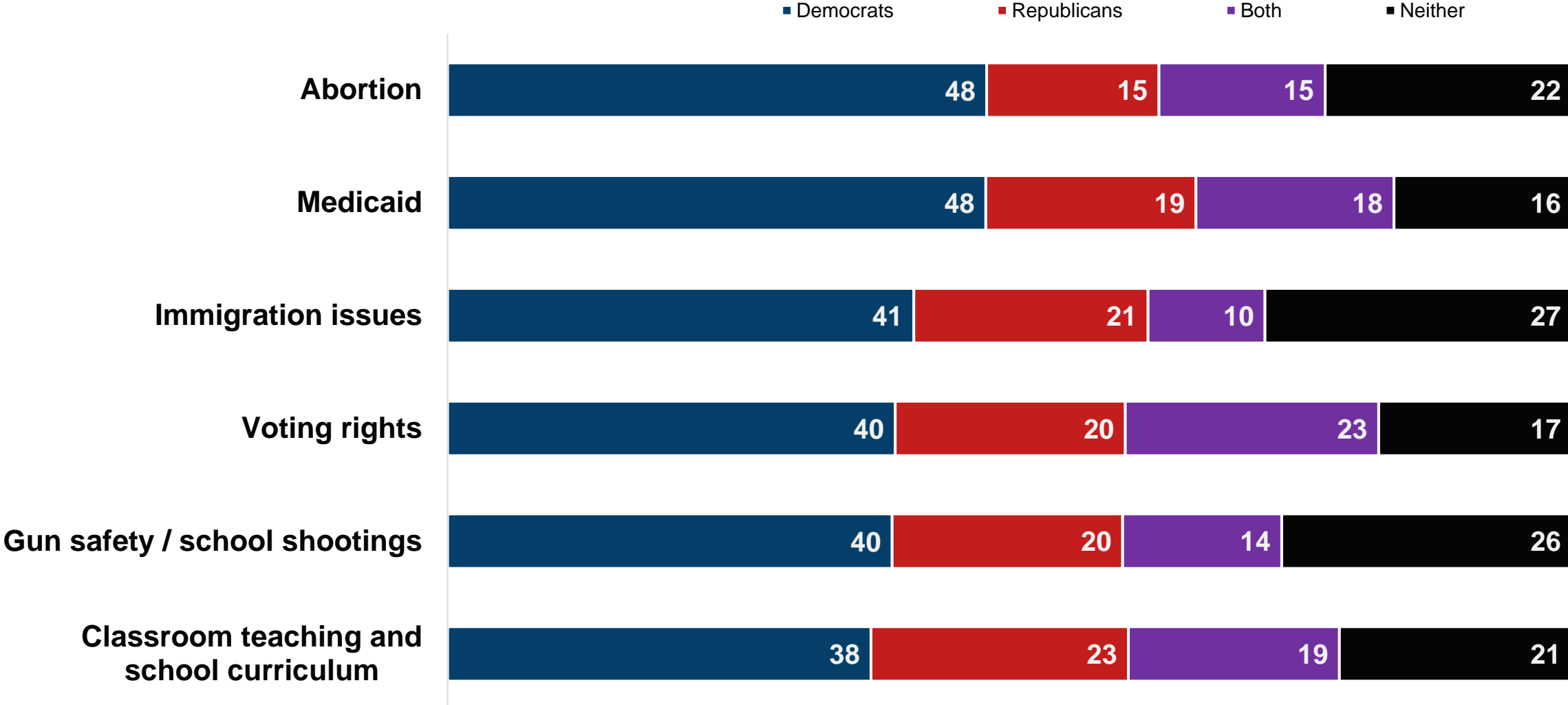

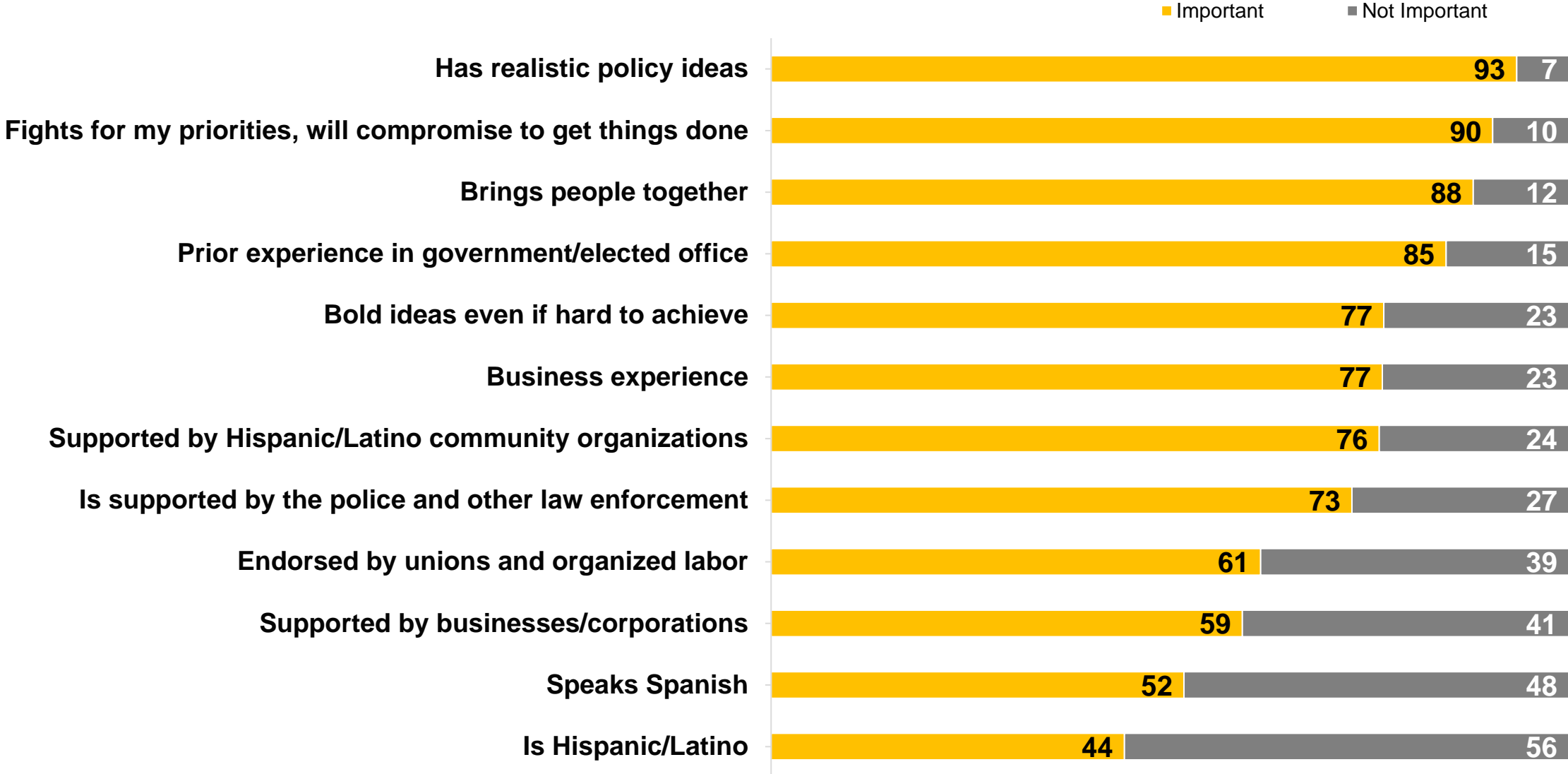

Thinking about the election coming up in November of this year, which party do you think would do a better job handling each of the following issues:



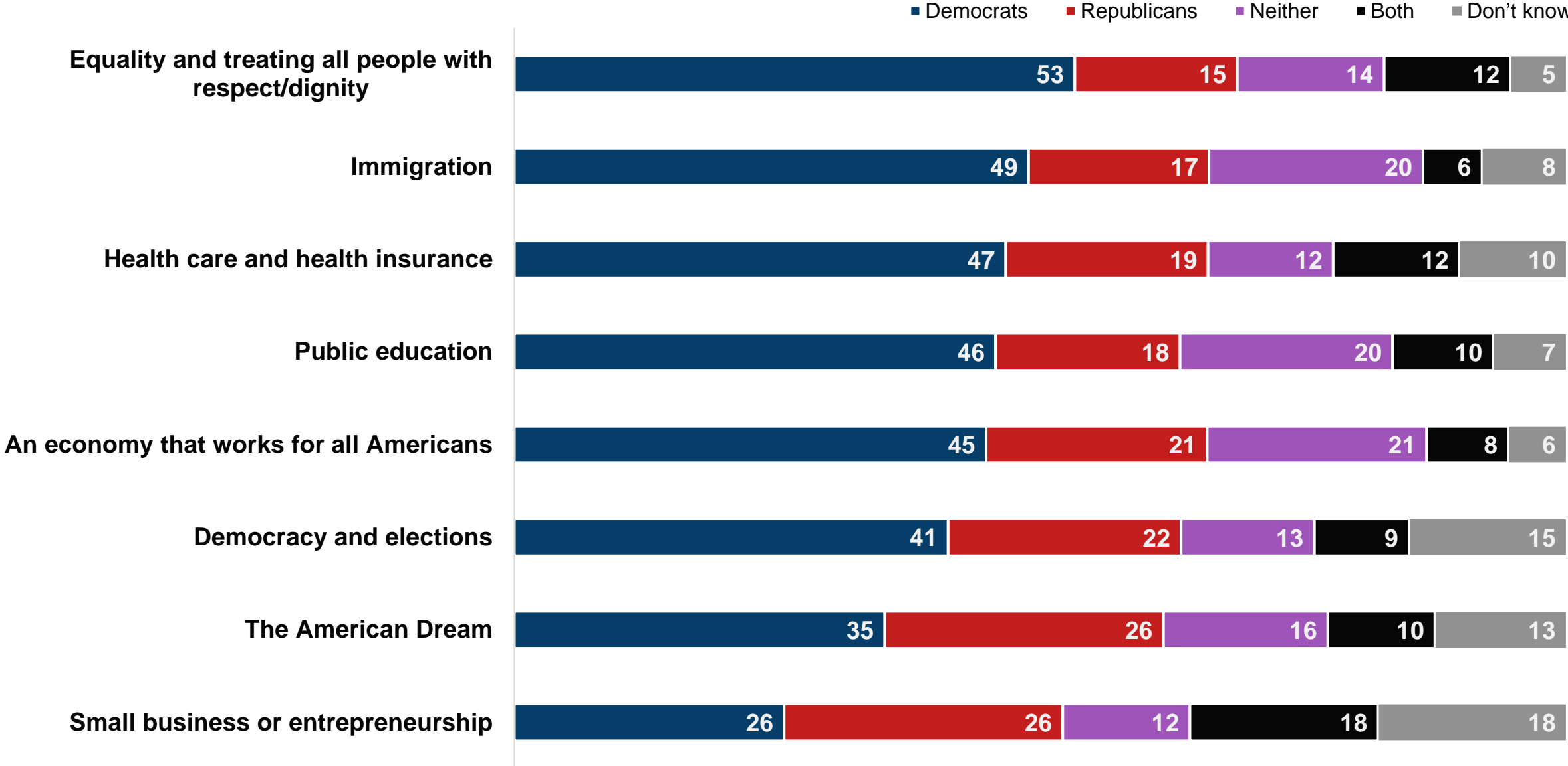

In making decisions about which candidates to support in an election, how important is it to you that a candidate has the following traits or background?



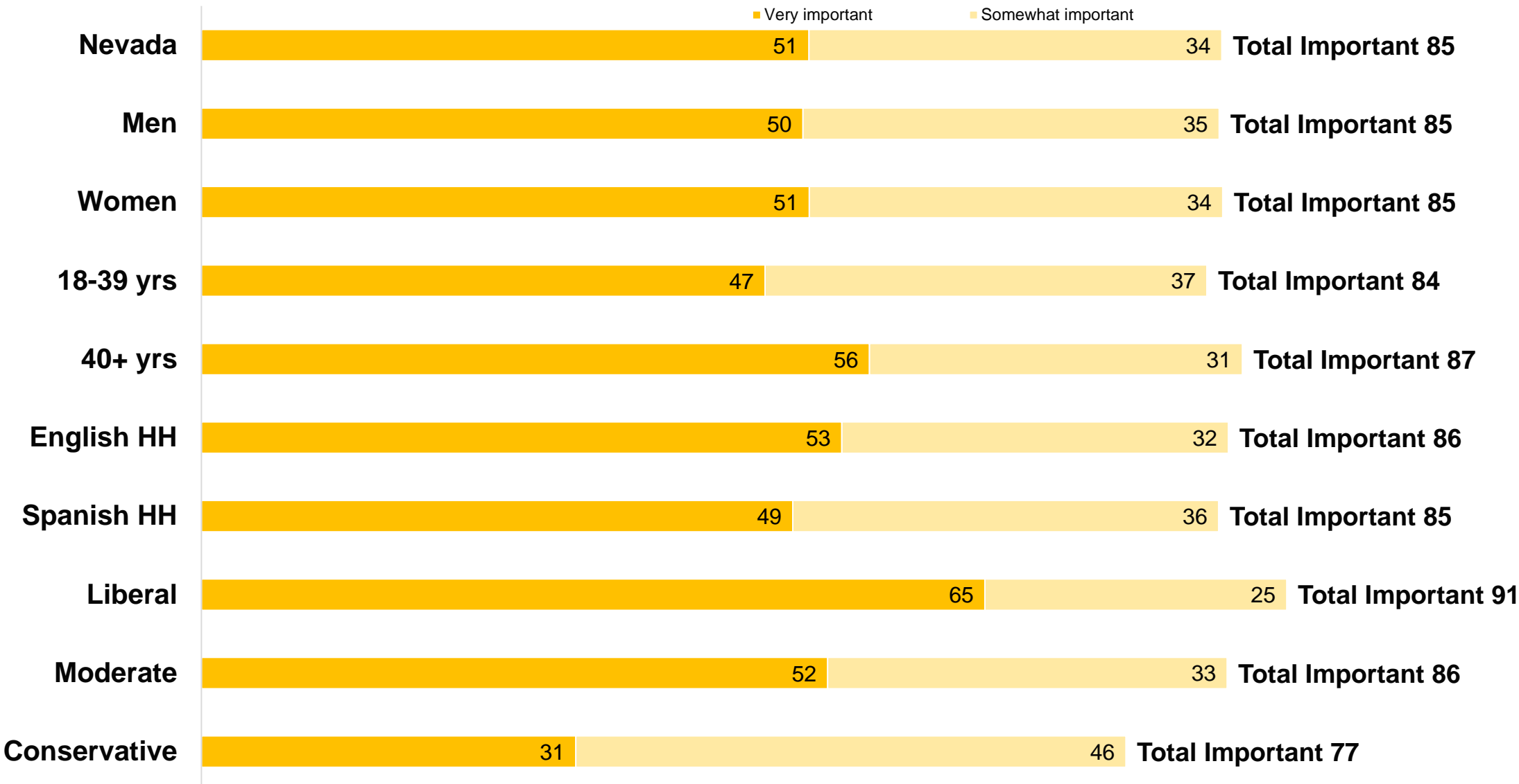

Generally speaking, which party do you believe shares your values, or is closer to your personal beliefs/values when it comes to your views on:



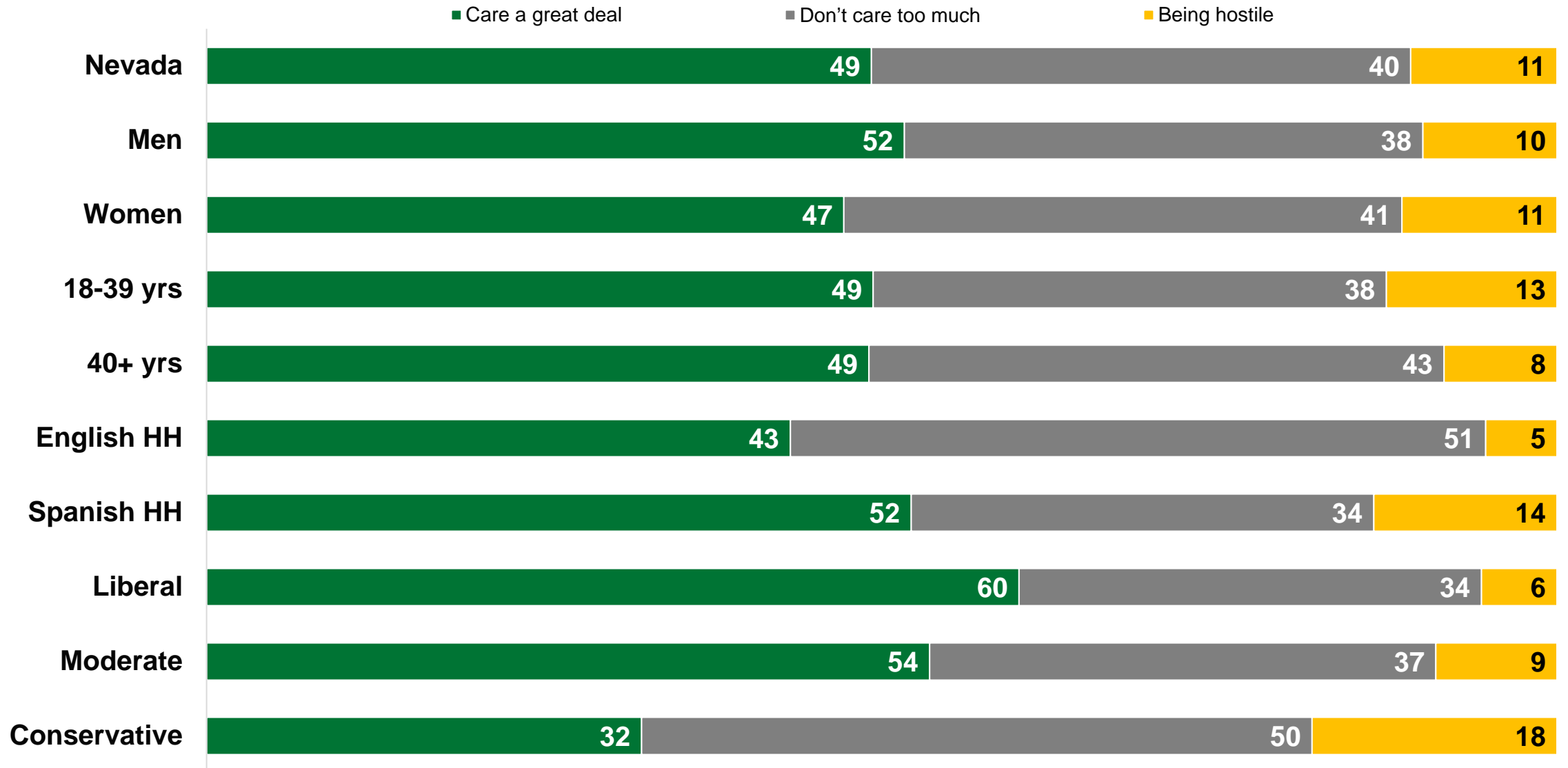

How important is it to you, personally, for elected officials and other leaders to speak out against hate speech, White nationalism and White supremacy? (% important reported)

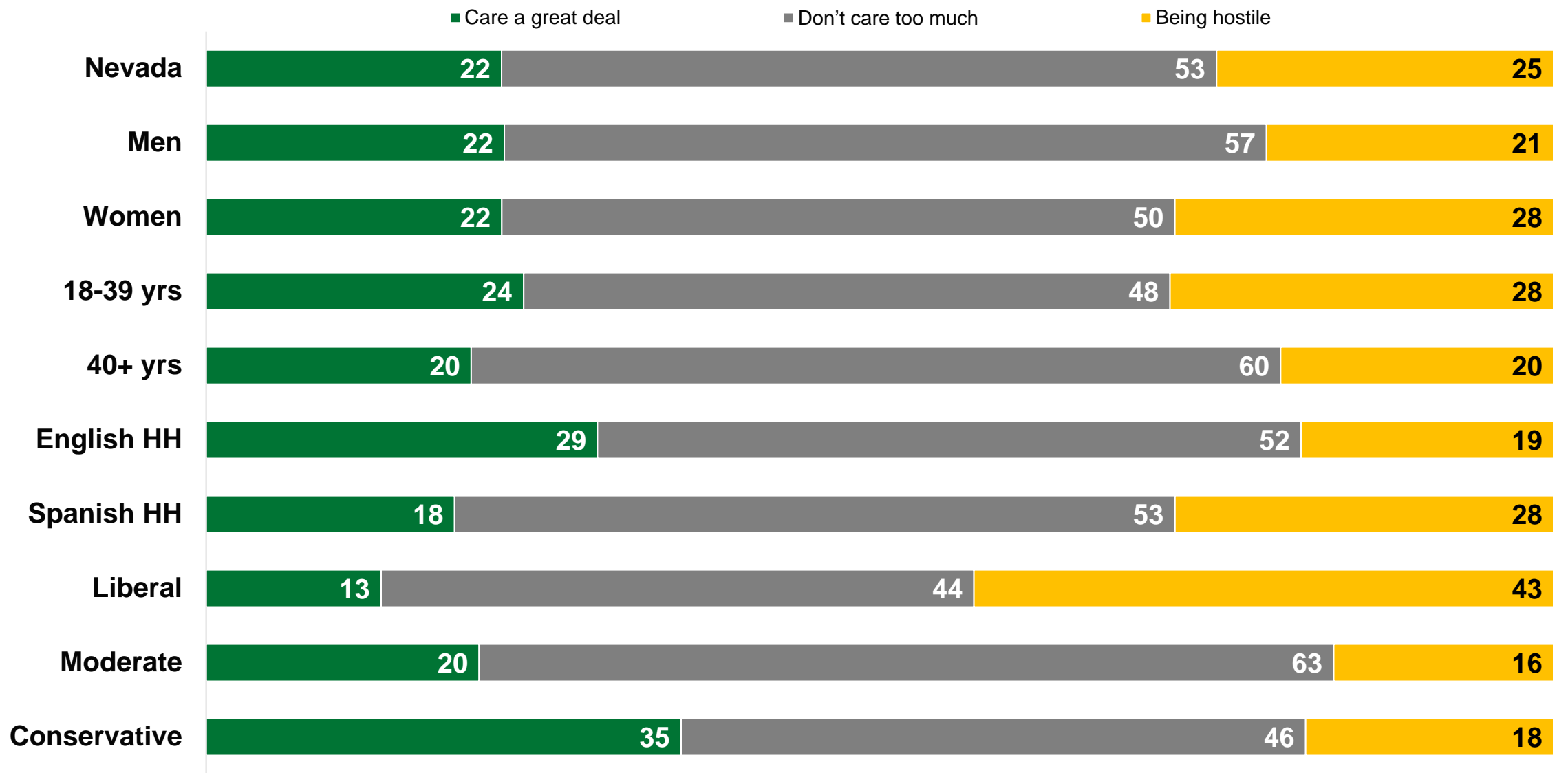

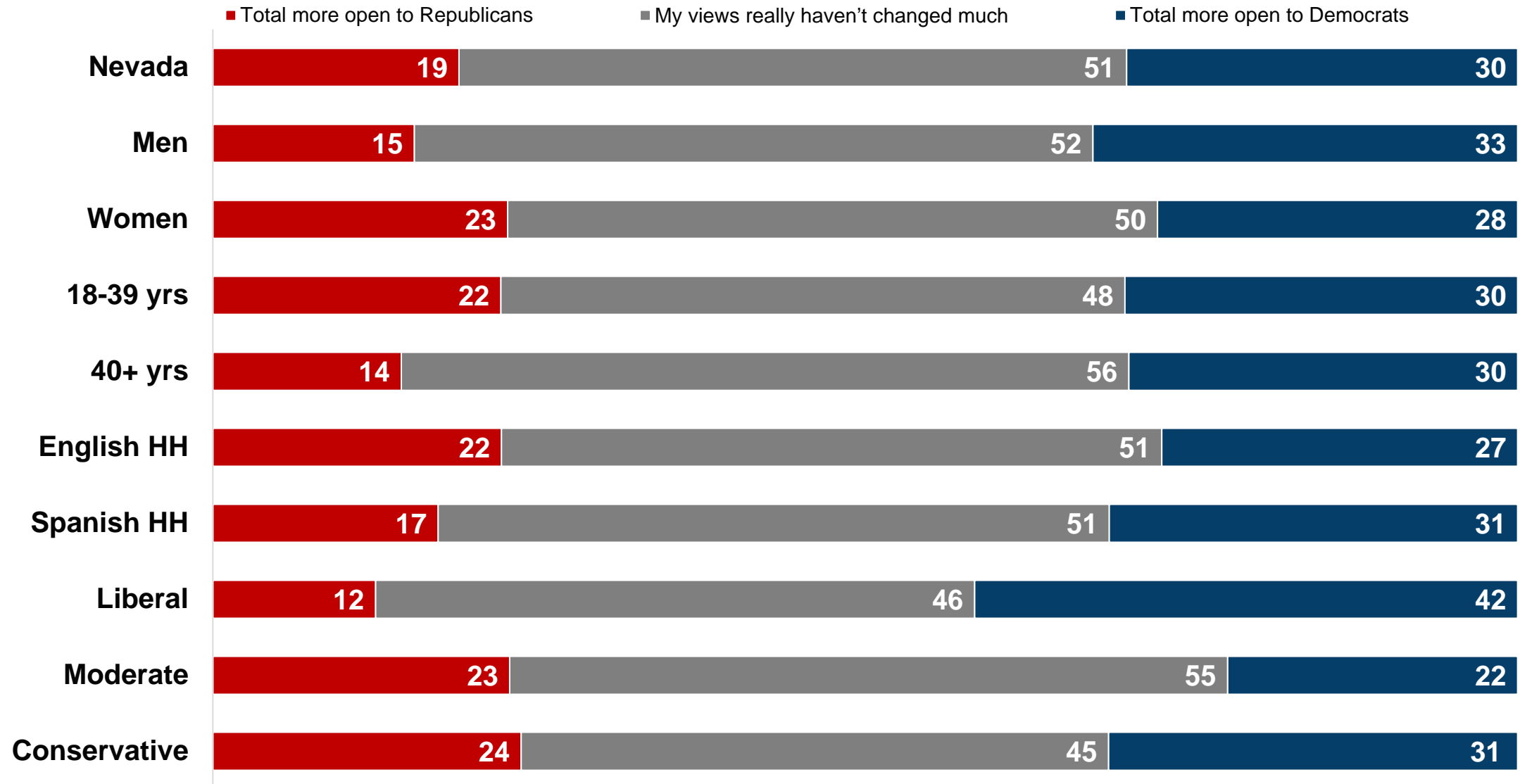

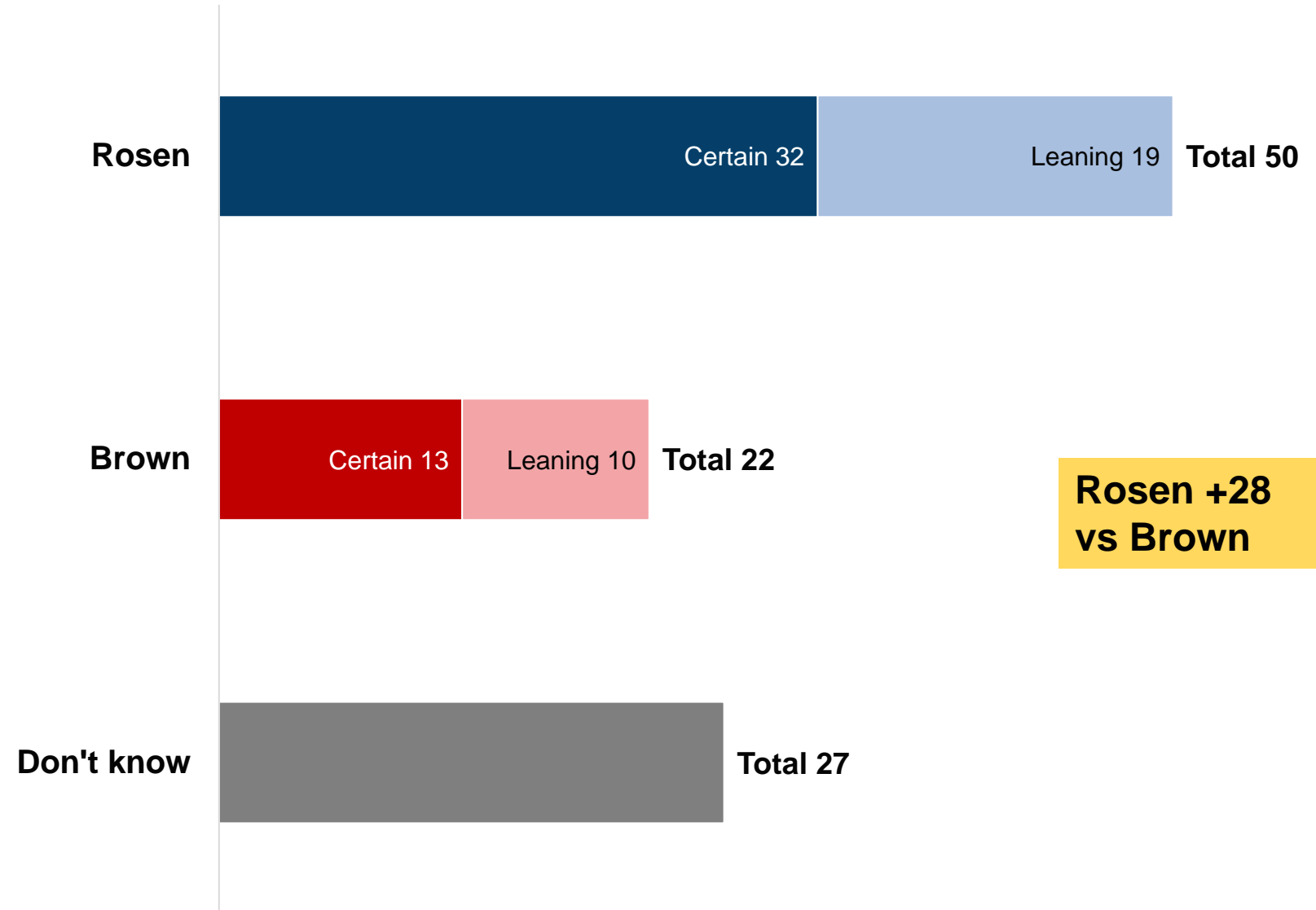

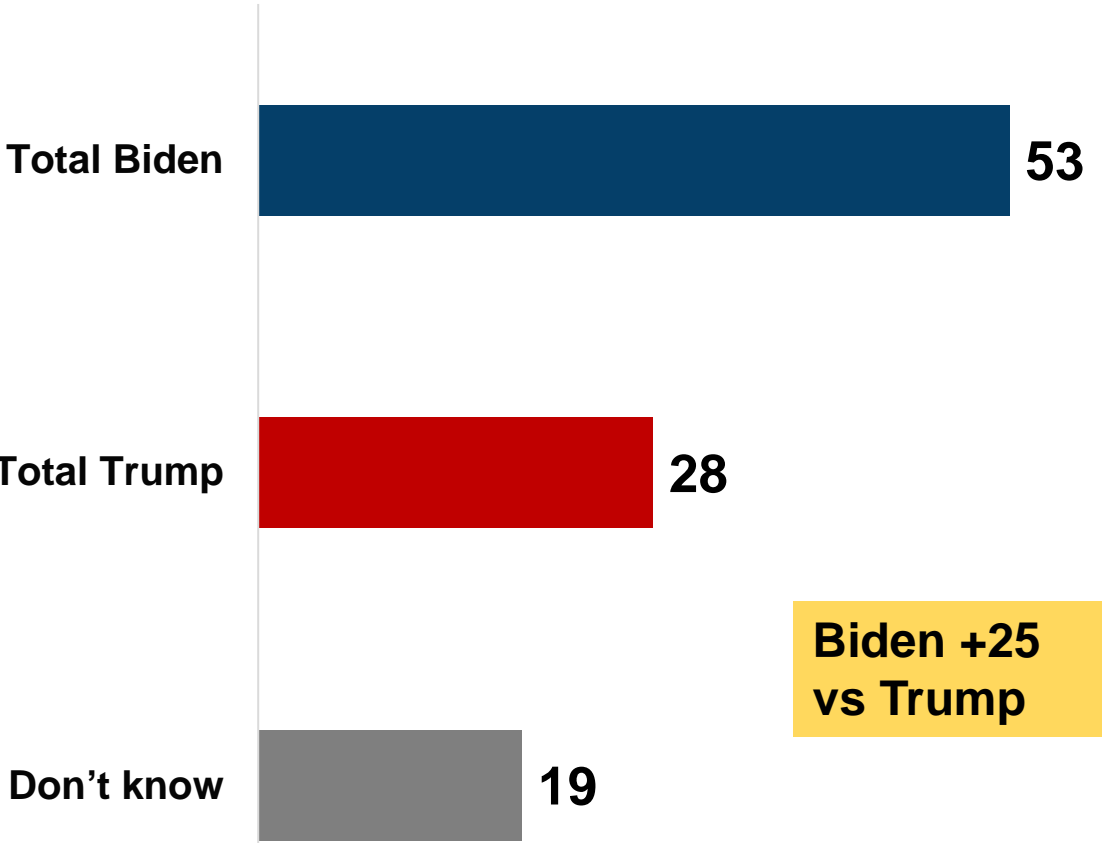
Thinking about the 2024 election for U.S. Senate in Nevada, do you plan to vote for Democrat Jackie Rosen or Republican Sam Brown?



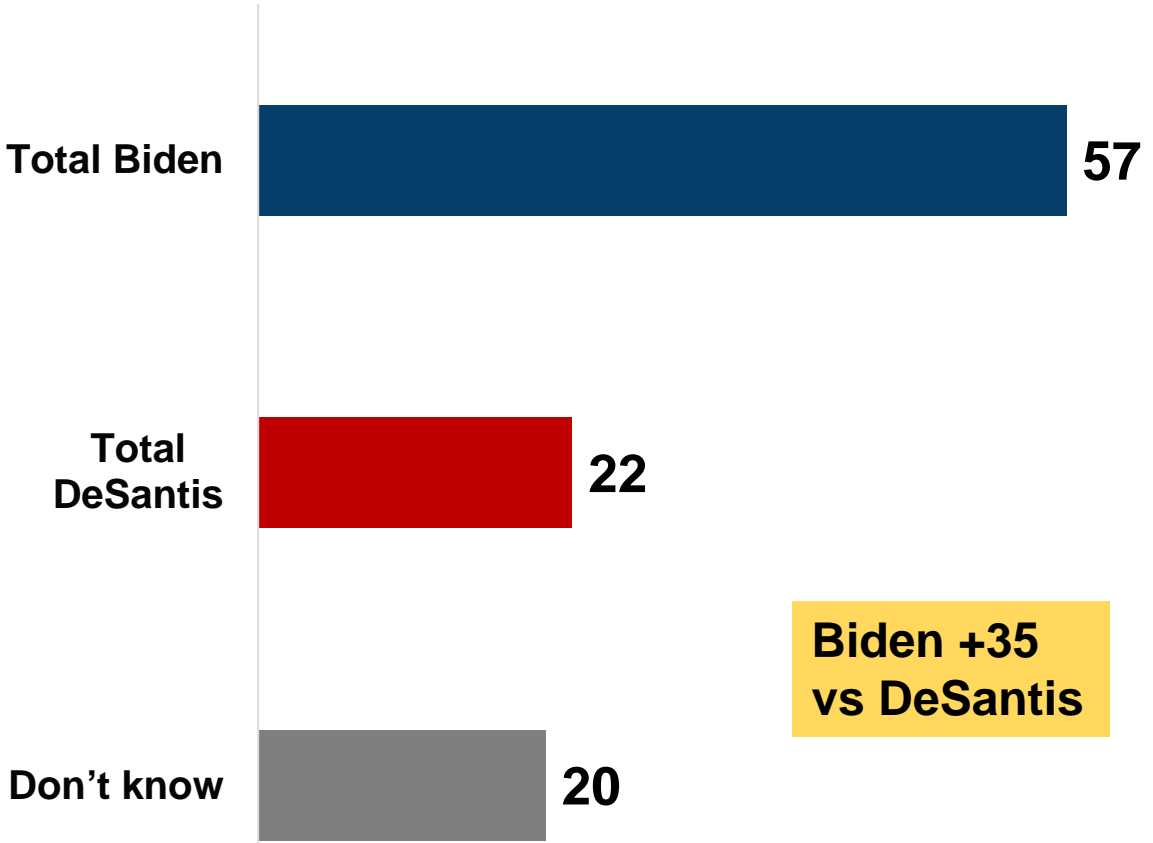

Biden vs Trump

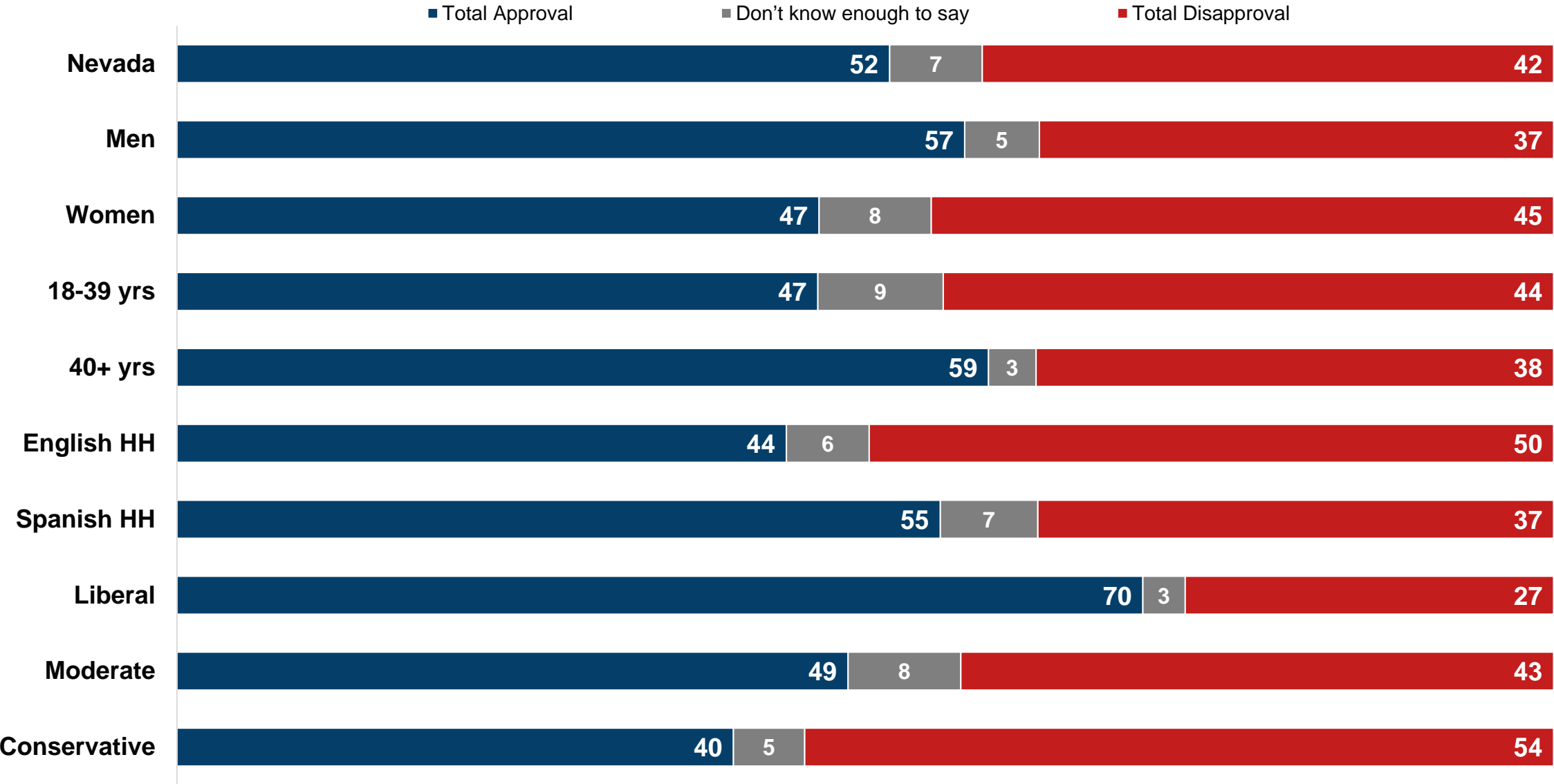


Biden vs DeSantis



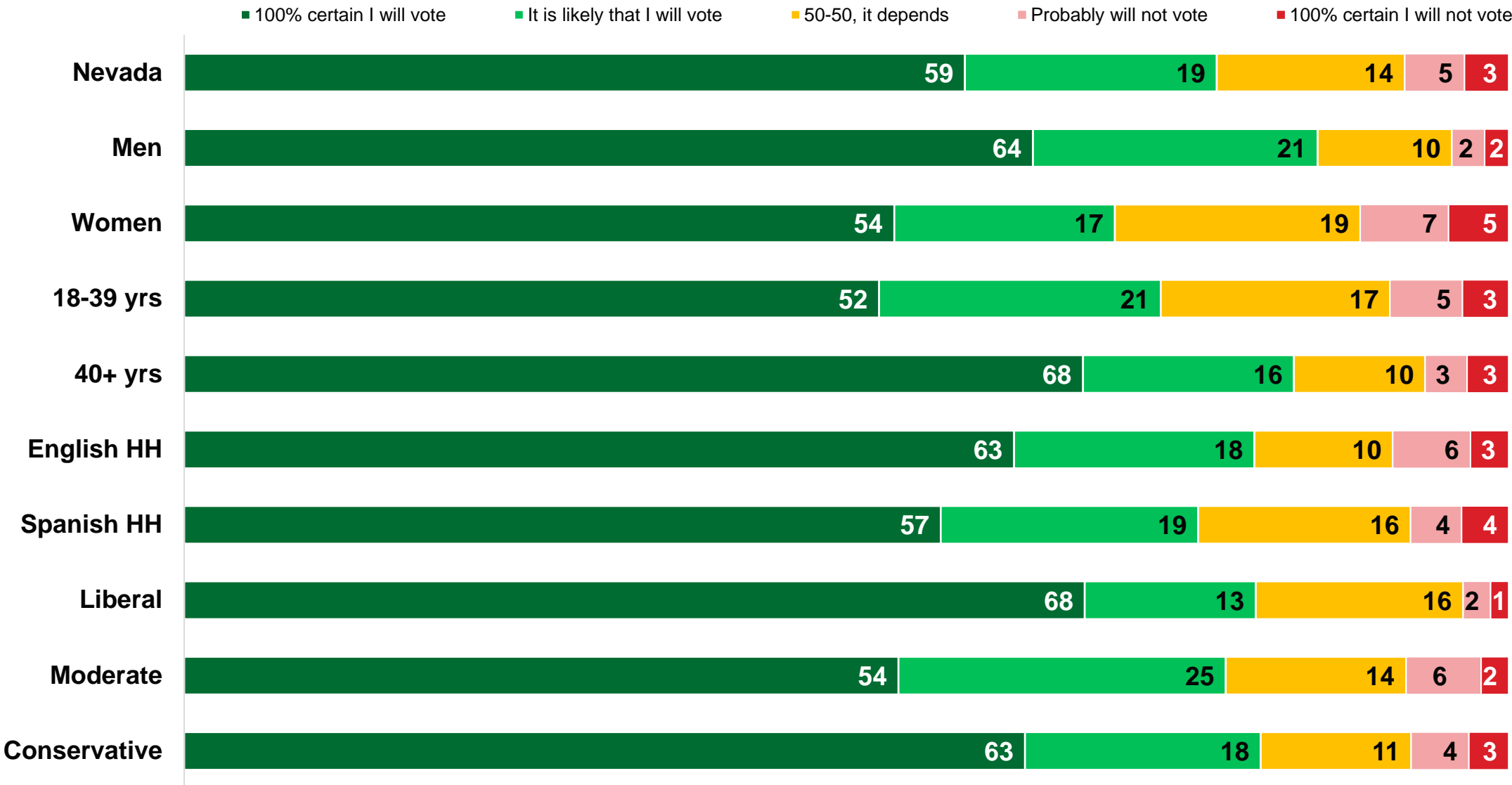
