#### Methodology

The 2024 American Electorate Voter Poll is a large-scale poll of Black, Latino, Asian American, Native American and White voters nationally as well as in key states that will determine the 2024 presidential election. On behalf of more than a dozen leading national civic organizations that work to engage diverse communities, the poll was implemented by data scientists and polling experts from Barreto-Segura Partners (BSP) Research, The African American Research Collaborative, and Harvard University. Overall, the election poll targets over 9,000 voters in the final days before the November 2024, and has a margin of error of 1.03%.

The poll is implemented for all racial/ethnic groups nationwide and includes robust samples within specific battleground states including: Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. The poll provides additional data in California, Texas and Florida, as these states are home to such a large population of minority voters.

Respondents are selected from the voter file, and confirmed to be registered to vote. They are randomly contacted for an interview by telephone live-caller, SMS text message, email or online panel. Whether on phone or online, all respondents had the option to complete the survey in English, Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Tagalog, or Vietnamese, according to their preference. The poll was in the field during early voting and continued through the evening of November 4th. Voters were confirmed to have already voted early, or in the final days, were 100% certain they were voting on Election Day. Weights are employed to balance the sample for demographic characteristics, with allowance for differential turnout rates, based on historic turnout data and current turnout models.
