METHODOLOGY

The poll interviewed 1,002 Latino registered voters nationwide from April 11-20, 2025 with a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percent. The survey was available in English or Spanish at the discretion of the respondent. Overall 21% of surveys were completed in Spanish. Respondents were reached via live telephone, text-message invite, and through online panels. All respondents were confirmed to be registered to vote. The sample was matched to the most recent U.S. Census estimates for the Latino registered voter population for age, education, nativity, Hispanic ethnicity, gender, and state. The sample was matched to the most recent national voter file for estimates of partisan affiliation. Overall 50% identified as Democrat, 27% as Republican and 23% as Independent. BSP Research and Shaw & Company wrote the survey instrument and completed the analysis together.

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
