METHODOLOGY

On behalf of UnidosUS, BSP Research and Shaw & Company research conducted a poll of 3,000 Latino registered voters across the United States between April 27 and May 14, 2026. The overall margin of error is ± 1.8 percentage points.

Respondents in four target states, two geographic regions, and 32 competitive congressional districts are oversampled in the survey: Arizona (N=200 across AZ-01, AZ-02, and AZ-06), California (N=300 across CA-13, CA-21, CA-22, CA-45, and CA-48), Florida (N=300 across FL-07, FL-13, FL-23, and FL-27), Texas (N=300 across TX-15, TX-23, TX-28, TX-34, and TX-35), the Northeast corridor (N=300 across NJ-07, NJ-09, NY-03, NY-04, NY-17, PA-07, PA-08, and PA-10), and the Southwest (N=300 across NM-02, NV-01, NV-03, NV-04, CO-03, CO-05, and CO-08). Congressional districts were selected based on 2026 competitiveness ratings from the Cook Political Report and the share of Latino eligible and registered voters.

In California, Florida, and Texas, 500 Latino registered voters were surveyed in each state; these stand-alone samples have a margin of error of ± 4.4 percentage points. In Arizona, 400 Latino registered voters were surveyed, yielding a margin of error of ± 4.9 percentage points.

The survey was offered in English or Spanish, based on respondent preference. Overall, 25% of surveys were completed in Spanish. Respondents were reached via live telephone interviews, text-message invitations, and online panels. All participants were confirmed to be registered voters. The sample was weighted to align with the most recent U.S. Census estimates for Latino registered voters by age, education, nativity, Hispanic subgroup, gender, and state.
